Collapsing to One Ready Category

• Pros

- Only one set of requirements to worry about
- No prioritizing of one path over another
- Easier to communicate to stakeholders
- Lots of other ways to provide accolades
- Cons
 - Discuss

Pathway Endorsement as a Direct Path to "Ready"

- Pros
 - Addresses issue of students who get off track early with their GPA not having a path to readiness
 - Address issue of students who are otherwise "ready" but miss the attendance requirement
- Cons
 - Heard some concerns from the last meeting about letting go of either attendance or GPA

Career Ready Indicators - Concerns

- Less than 50% completed 2 career ready indicators & only 27% completed 3+.
- Concerns with modifying:
 - Heard concerns at the last meeting over reducing the number from 3
 - Heard concerns about districts emphasizing less rigorous career ready experiences like co-curricular activities (e.g., sports & clubs) and community service
 - Heard concerns over students taking a purely academic path
 - Other concerns?
- Tension between allowing a wide range of options to support accessibility vs. incentivizing intentional programming (a.k.a. no "random acts of AP")
 - Limiting options encourages well designed programming but if too prescriptive can be interpreted as conflicting with local control and/or being too inflexible to implement to requirements

Career Ready Indicators – Options to Address Concerns

- Changing Core Requirement from 1 to 2 (in new structure)
- Excluding co-curricular activities, community service, ASVAB scores, etc. as ways to fulfill core requirements (new structure)
- Allowing multiple experiences of a particular type to count as multiple indicators
 - Option: Dual-credit credit earned courses
 - Would it be a 1 to 1 relationship or a 1 to 1+2 relationship? First dual-credit would fulfil 1 indicator and 2 additional dual credit (3 total) would fulfill 2 indicators.
 - Option: Career development experiences in BOTH Jr and Sr year fulfills 2 career ready indicators
 - Should it be two different placements? Could two years in the same placement count twice?
