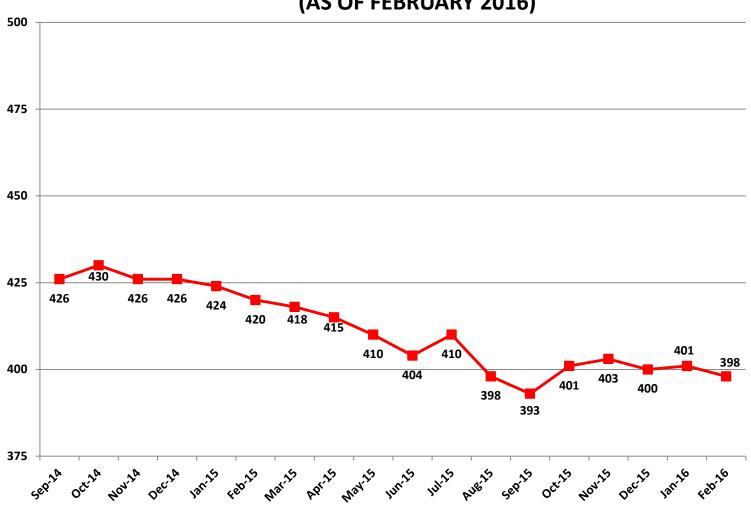

18-MONTH HEADCOUNT HISTORY (AS OF FEBRUARY 2016)



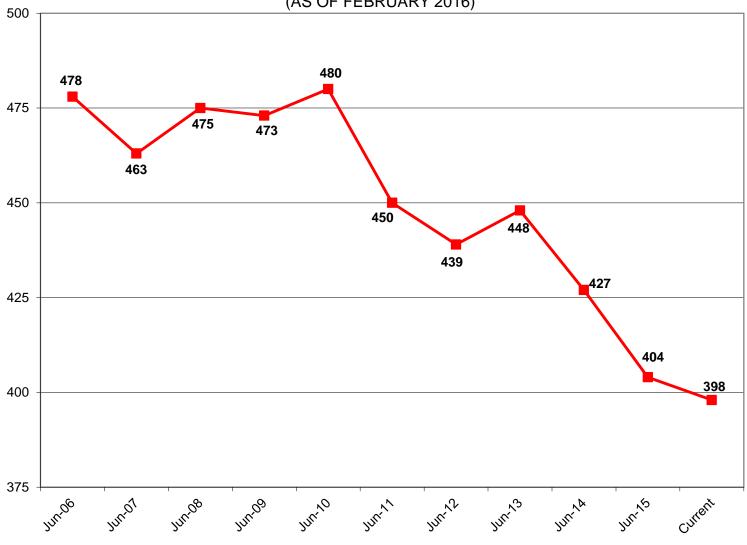
