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Charter Schools Program (CSP)-Quality School Options (QSO)

What is the Charter Schools Program (CSP)-Quality Schools Options Grant? The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) was awarded \$42 million via the federal CSP grant to increase the number of high-quality charter schools in Illinois. ISBE's grant seeks to increase by 48 new charters (24 new charters in Chicago and 24 new charters outside of Chicago) over the next 5 years and will evaluate the effects of charter schools, including their effects on students (in particular, on student academic achievement).

Ш	<b>Program Design:</b> Not-for-profit entities with a strong educational background are eligible to apply
	provided they submit a charter school proposal to the desired authorizer and are awaiting
	authorization are eligible to apply for a program design grant. Additionally, charter schools that
	are operated by not-for-profit entities, have an executed charter agreement with a local schoo
	board and have not yet opened for student attendance are eligible to apply for a program design
	grant.
	<b>Implementation:</b> Charter schools that are operated by not-for-profit entities, have an executed charter agreement with a local school board and <b>have been opened</b> for student attendance for
	two years or less are eligible to apply for an <b>implementation grant</b> .
	Dissemination: Charter schools that are operated by not-for-profit entities, have an executed

Dissemination: Charter schools that are operated by not-for-profit entities, have an executed charter agreement with a local school board and have been open for student attendance for three years or longer are eligible to apply for dissemination grant. There are two dissemination subgrants- Student Body Diversity and Student Achievement and Educational Innovation seeking successful charter schools to assist other schools in adapting the charter school's program (or certain aspects).

## **Grant Awards:**

<b>Program Design:</b> up to \$150,000 per award for a maximum of 18 months
Implementation: up to \$400,000 per year, for a maximum of 2 years
Dissemination: two subgrants 1) up to \$50,000 for Student Body Diversity and 2) up to \$150,000
for Student Achievement and Educational Innovation. Each subgrant is for two years of funding.

**Grant Period:** Program Design awards will be for a maximum of 18 months. Implementation awards will be for a maximum of 24 months. Applicants will be advised to plan the **program design** and **implementation** activities of each grant according to the time limits established for each grant category such that activities will collectively **span no more than 36 months**. **Dissemination awards** will be a one-time award for eligible applicant.

**Timing and Type of RFP:** To ensure competitive grant deliverables are met, there will be multiple Request for Proposals (RFP). The tentative timeline for the release of RFP's is:
