#### **FY20 TITLE III LIEP GRANT APPLICATION**

The fiscal year 2020 Title III LIEP Grant Application is now available in the electronic Grant Management System (eGMS) through the ISBE Web Application Security (IWAS). If your district has an approved FY20 Title III Intent to Apply on file with the Division of English Learners, you now have to complete the FY20 Title III LIEP Grant Application. #### WHAT IS NEW IN THE FY 2020 TITLE III APP?

School districts applying for federal Title III LIEP and/or Immigrant Program Grants are also required to complete the Consolidated District Plan (CDP). In addition, there are several changes to the FY 2020 Title III online grant application. One major change is the programmatic and accountability sections. They were removed and are now addressed in the CDP. Also, districts will need to complete the Detailed Budget Page in greater detail.

## FISCAL YEAR 2019 ENGLISH LEARNERS EVIDENCE-BASED FUNDING (EL-EBF) **EXPENDITURE REPORTING (COMING SOON!)**

The EBF law passed on Aug. 31, 2017, requires the Illinois State Board of Education to notify school districts of the total English Learner (EL) funding generated by each district's students. This composite amount of funds includes any EL funds generated under the Base Funding Minimum and Tier Funding. It does not include funding generated by the core investment cost factors of the EBF formula, the money from which also benefits ELs. Districts were reminded that state funding attributable to ELs was to be spent on EL services per the requirements of Article 14C of the School Code. Article 14C also requires that at least 60 percent of EL funds must be spent on instructional costs of ELs (Function 1000).

The FY 2019 EL-EBF expenditure reporting shows where EBF funds attributable to ELs were ultimately spent within each district. At the recommendation of the Illinois Advisory Council on Bilingual Education, only districts that received \$5,000 or more in total FY 2019 EL funds will be required to submit an expenditure report through the period ending June 30, 2019. Additionally, carry forward was permissible in FY18. Any FY18 EL-EBF funds not expended in FY18 will appear in the FY19 expenditure report. Districts should not have carry forward for FY19 funds into FY20. #### BREAKING AWAY FROM TRADITION TO MEET STUDENT NEEDS

Community Unit School District 300 Foundation for Educational Excellence recently announced the 2019 Distinguished Educator award to Mr. Jesus Romero, who teaches a preschool class within Lakewood Elementary School. Mr. Romero came to District 300 from Spain five years ago as part of the Exchange Visitor Teacher program. Within a short time teaching at Lakewood, as well as deLacey Family Education Center before that, Mr. Romero attained Gold status for a quality preschool classroom through the Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale and Classroom Assessment Scoring System.

Mr. Romero uses a variety of innovative educational strategies, including trauma-informed practices. He leads students through yoga and meditation, for example, to ensure they are able to focus and engage in learning. A talented guitar and ukulele player and singer, Mr. Romero also incorporates music into his lessons. He even wrote and recorded the deLacey school theme song, relating it to the school's Positive Behavior Intervention and Support expectations. In the short time, that Mr. Romero has been in the district he has served in several committees all focusing on the social emotional well-being of students.

### **Kindergarten Field Test**

WIDA is looking for schools to administer the new Kindergarten Screener to at least 20 students during one or two field testing windows throughout 2019 and early 2020. <u>Kindergarten Screener Field Test flyer</u>

There are two field test windows.

- Field Test Window 1: July 29, 2019 through October 4, 2019 for incoming kindergarten and first grade students
- Field Test Window 2: January 6, 2020 through February 28, 2020 for currently enrolled kindergarten students
- WIDA will provide all test materials and will work with each field test site to make test administration arrangements.
- The Kindergarten Screener is delivered individually, on paper.
- Allow one hour for testing each child. It takes approximately 45 minutes to administer all four language domains.
