ACCESS Test for English Learners Pushed from Possible Start Date of Jan. 4 To No Sooner Than March 15

...The original administration window for the ACCESS test, which measures the proficiency of English Learners in reading, writing, speaking and listening, would have allowed schools to begin testing as early as Jan. 4. ISBE's action today ensures no student will take a federally required assessment, including ACCESS, until March 15 at the earliest. For more information, click here.

FY 2021 EL - Title III Immigrant Student Education Program (ISEP) Now Available in IWAS

Applications for the EL - Title III Immigrant Student Education Program are now available through IWAS for school year 2020-2021 (FY 2021). The list of eligible and non-eligible school districts that have submitted an Intent to Apply for the FY21 Immigrant Student Education Program grant is now posted on the Multilingual Department's website. Under Title III of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), as amended by Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), eligibility and funding for the Title III Immigrant Student Education Program grant must be based on the total current year enrollment of immigrant students in the district and non-public schools within the district's boundary. All eligible applicants must create and apply through the IWAS system. To create an application, select "Year: 2021" and choose "Create Application." If a checkbox appears the applicant must select "Yes" before creating an application. Districts with carry over funds from last fiscal year will need to create an FY 2021 application to use the carryover funds.

Note: The title of this grant application has changed this year, so please make sure that you are given access authorization from your administrator to create the application. You will need to request authorization in IWAS to the EL – Title III Immigrant Student Education Program system. Your superintendent will then need to approve your access.

Due Date: To ensure a September 1, 2020, start date, complete and submit the application to ISBE by January 15, 2021.

EQUITABLE ACCESS TO EDUCATIONAL EXCELLENCE: FRAMING SERVICES FOR ENGLISH LEARNERS IN ILLINOIS

Screening and Testing

Provisional ELs and ACCESS Testing

Provisional ELs (i.e., new ELs identified by the Provisional Screener but not a standard EL screener) should not participate in ACCESS testing until they qualify for services with a standard screening. If the standard screening occurs on January 4, 2021 or later, participation in ACCESS for 2020-2021 is optional.

ACCESS for ELLs and other Assessment Guidance

The ISBE- Assessment Department has developed guidance to support school districts with spring 2021 assessment administration, including ACCESS and Alternate ACCESS, during the COVID-19 pandemic. Revised Guidance on Completion of English Learner Record of Provisionally Identified Students

Previously, guidance from the Illinois State Board of Education Multilingual Department instructed districts to not complete English Learner (EL) demographic information, including the EL indicator and program information located in the Student Information System (SIS), after a student was identified as an EL via provisional screening. However, ISBE is making a substantial change after receiving additional guidance from the U. S. Department of Education. This change is to ensure that a district's ELs are counted for state and federal funding (e.g., Evidence Based Funding, Title III formulaic grants). For more information, click here.
