IMPORTANT! FY 2022 Program Delivery Report

The 2021-22 school year Bilingual Education Program Delivery Report (PDR) became available for completion in IWAS on May 16. Districts that received \$5,000 or more of state English Learners-Evidence-Based Funding (EL-EBF) for EL services and/or federal Title III Language Instruction Educational Program (LIEP) funds in fiscal year 2022 were to have submitted this report in IWAS no later than July 31. The PDR system remains open until September 15. Please submit your PDR immediately if you have not yet done so.

The FY 2022 EL-EBF Expenditure Reporting had been completed in the IWAS Electronic Expenditure Reporting System and was due to ISBE by July 20.



Early Childhood Resources

NEW! WIDA Screener for Kindergarten is Available!

The WIDA Screener for Kindergarten was activated on Aug. 3 for districts to begin the self-paced training and subsequent download of the screener.

The training and free download of the screening instrument are posted in the <u>WIDA Secure Portal</u>. Preprinted copies of the new screener may then be purchased from the <u>WIDA Store</u> by district WIDA account coordinators or district test coordinators.

In addition to the training, a webinar that previews the WIDA Kindergarten Screener that is to be adopted is currently available on the <u>WIDA Secure Portal</u>. Once in the portal, click "Professional Learning">Click on "Webinars" in title bar. Scroll to "Kindergarten ACCESS for ELLs for New Test Administrators" for the webinar.

The WIDA Screener for Kindergarten assesses English levels of potential English learners entering kindergarten and the first semester of Grade 1. Students who score below a 5.0 on the oral (listening, speaking) composite for the first semester of kindergarten or 5.0 on the overall (all four domains) composite for the second semester of kindergarten or first semester of Grade 1 will be eligible for language support services.

Districts may continue to use the WIDA MODEL for Kindergarten as part of the transition to the WIDA Screener for Kindergarten through the 2022-23 school year. *The WIDA MODEL will then be retired at the end of the 2022-23 school year*, with the WIDA Screener for Kindergarten being the only prescribed kindergarten screener.

2022 ACCESS for ELLs

- Currently, districts should be able to access the 2022 ACCESS for ELLs Individual Student Reports (ISR) in WIDA
 AMS. Districts received their paper ISRs in early August.
- Final scores will be posted in the Student Information System in late August or mid-September.

NEW RESEARCH REPORT EXAMINING LONG-TERM GROWTH TRAJECTORIES OF ELS WITH AND WITHOUT IEPS

WIDA was motivated by findings of a 2018 WIDA report pointing to a large overlap between ELs with Individualized Education Program (IEP) designations and ELs who could be identified as long-term ELs to conduct a study to further focus on these dual-identified students. We grouped ELs by ever-IEP (those who were assigned an IEP at any point in their longitudinal record) and never-IEP status and compared these two subgroups' English language growth trajectories across time for 24 independent cohorts of ELs starting in Grades K-3 throughout 2006-11. Our findings show consistent trends of differential growth and reclassification rates for these two subgroups. Read more

- With a parent, spouse, or guardian who is a migrant agricultural worker or on their own as migrant agricultural workers.

Districts may refer families who are potentially eligible for the program. The program will arrange for a certified migrant child recruiter to interview the family to determine eligibility.
