

Request 5: List of all teachers and administrators listed on ELIS employed by St. Charles CUSD 303 marked as Deceased "No"

Request 6: How many days/hours by law can a retired administrator work? What are the consequences for an administrator that works beyond the allowed days/hours after retirement.

Response 6:

- Response 6: Retired means drawing an annuity from either the Teachers' Retirement System of the State of Illinois or the Public School Teachers' Pension and Retirement Fund – Cities over 500,000 Inhabitants (23 IAC 25.444(c)(1)(B)).
- Retirees must record their retirement status in ELIS prior to 8/31 of the last year of the five-year renewal cycle during which they retire (23 IAC 25.830(f)). Failure to do so may result in a lapsed license. The requirements for reinstating a lapsed license are 1) a \$500 reinstatement fee **OR** 2) completion of 9 semester hours of college coursework in the educators' endorsement area(s) (23 IAC 25.450(b)).
- Retired educators are exempt from professional development unless they return to work in a position requiring a license. For each year a retiree works in a position requiring a license for 50% FTE or more, he/she is required to complete 20% of the PD and all of the Administrator Academy courses required for the endorsement area in which they work (23 IAC 25.805(g)).
- A retiree whose license is in retired status, who holds a professional educator license, and who works only as a substitute teacher for less than 50% full-time equivalency per school year, is not required to complete professional development (23 IAC 25.400(h))
- A licensee who does not enter all of his or her professional development activities prior to September 1 of the year in which the 5-year renewal cycle ends may not be able to preserve his or her right of appeal regarding a recommendation for nonrenewal of his or her license (23 IAC 25.830(g)).
- A license in retired status cannot lapse (105 ILCS 5/21B-45(e)(6)).
