    - Committee will meeting in early January to discuss assessment contents.

11:30-12:30 Angela Chamness, Division Administrator for Assessment, ISBE Dan Frederking, Assessment, ISBE/Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers Overview (PARCC)

- Grades 3-11 testing
- Computer based
- o Start 2014-2015
- Pilot testing this spring
- Test critical thinking and problem solving skills
- Writing is fully integrated all the way through high school
- o Technology enhanced, all students will need headphones and keyboards
- Performance Based Assessment (PBA) approximately 75% through the year
- End of the Year (EOY) assessment approximately 90% through the year
- Speaking and listening test
- English Language Arts (ELA) passages are from real text, not commissioned passages.
- o Combining scores PBA and EOY for final score
- $\circ \quad \text{Not a growth model} \\$
- PARCC at the high school level: used a "placement" for college course work.
- o ACT for "admission"
  - What if a gifted student takes a high school course in middle school? This question and other similar to advanced work need direction.
- Resources
  - PARCC online best place to get resources
  - o Public has access to some of the assessment tasks
- Illinois Education Leadership Cadre, a group of state wide experts to support the implementation of the Illinois Learning Standards.
- Student Learning Objectives (SLO's) for gifted will be a focus of next meeting topics to include but not limited to:
  - Balanced Assessment
  - Preparation and Evaluation
  - Systems responsive and responsible
  - Around areas of student growth
  - How gifted educators would be evaluated with gifted students
  - Assessment development message development
  - o Assessment practice
  - Measuring student growth
  - Angela Chamness from the ISBE Assessment Division will bring staff to help us develop SLOs.
