III. Illinois State Board of Education Update

Update on Various Topics – Dave Andel, Division Administrator, Special Education Services Division

State Performance Plan/Annual Performance Report (SPP/APR) – Was submitted to OSEP on Feb. 1st, meeting the required timeline for submission.

The **IDEA Part B Annual State Application** will be posted on the agency website on March 1, 2017 for the required 60 days, and public comment will be accepted from March 31, 2017 through May 1, 2017 for the required 30 day comment period. The application is due to the federal government on May 12th, 2017. The application provides general assurances to OSEP that the state will be implementing the provisions of state and federal regulations for Part B of IDEA 2004. The interactive spread sheet identifies amounts for State-level Administration and Targeted Initiatives. The spreadsheet is based upon the current year (FFY16) allocation since OSEP has yet to give the anticipated award amounts for FFY17. These amounts will be used until the FFY17 award amount is disclosed.

Comprehensive Continuous Improvement Monitoring System

Began the process by researching Departments of Education in each of the 49 states, especially looking for monitoring systems that were based on Result-driven Accountability that OSEP had introduced in 2013-2014 academic year as a way to support students outcomes and successes to close the gap for students with IEPs in the high incidence population group

- The Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) had begun a process to have SEAs oversee LEAs in their respective states to examine their data as part of Result-driven Accountability rather than for compliance only.
- One of the first areas to investigate was the expansion of our file review form to examine evaluation process of students and if found eligible, the corresponding IEP.
 We are in the final stage of developing this document and would like to conduct desk audits of 10 IEPs from districts in the state during this second semester of the academic 2016-2017 year. We would provide feedback to the district/school as well as have the opportunity of revising the form if necessary.
- The next phase was to examine the various stages of a comprehensive continuous improvement monitoring system, such as but not limited to
 - An integrated process within ISBE to provide monitoring to districts
 - Cyclical in nature
 - Development of self-assessment tool for districts/schools to use and a rubric to review the submitted self-assessment document
 - Conduct a desk audit of IEPs for the district/school
 - Develop a risk analysis document that would identify areas in the organization (district/school) that provide a comprehensive review of the district/school ability to promote result-driven accountability for students with IEPs and promote addressing and advancing learning objectives
 - A comprehensive review of all the above areas to determine a tier regarding the challenges in the district/school and then to identify a corresponding level of support if necessary
 - An on-site visit would be based on this comprehensive review and not all districts/schools in that year's cycle would require a visit
 - Reports customized to a specific aspect of the comprehensive review would be generated
 - Technical assistance would be part of level of support identified

LRE Data Cohort VII

- 9 districts are participating in Cohort VII 7 North and 2 South-Central
- First Seminar was conducted on December 1, 2016/North and December 8, 2016/South-Central
- Second Seminar February 28, 2017/North and March 7, 2017/South-Central

LRE Data Cohort VI

 10 districts completed the one year process – 5 on November 30, 2016/North and 5 on December 7, 2016/South Central

Non-Public 14-7.02 programs

• One Onsite Monitoring visit was conducted over the past three (3) months.

- New applications from programs are being reviewed as well as updates that have been received from existing programs
- A review of the 401 Rules was the focus of the past three months which culminated in a focus group meeting of representatives from districts and programs

December 1, 2016 Child Count – Deadline Extension

All local education agencies (LEAs) should continue work to ensure that all students with disabilities are entered and approved for the State's special education child count taken as of December 1, 2016. We are aware of the performance issues that have been occurring with I-Star and apologize for the frustration and inconvenience this has caused. Our highest priority is to improve system performance and user experience. We appreciate your patience.

Due to the I-Star performance issues we are extending the deadline for entering additions, deletions or changes to the student records that will be counted as of December 1st until **Tuesday**, **February 28**.

As reminder, in order for a record that is reported in I-Star to be included in the December 1st child count, their record will need to be listed as "approved". Before attempting to clean up any disapproved records, please click on Recheck Edits on your student approval page in I-Star.

IDEA Excess Cost

The excess cost deadline was January 31, 2017. Thank you to the vast majority of districts that submitted early and on time. The remaining few districts will receive notice regarding the freezing of the IDEA flow-through and preschool funds. We would like to avoid freezing any IDEA funds and encourage those remaining district to submit their worksheets immediately.

Coordinated Early Intervening Services (CEIS) Reporting

Each year ISBE must report to OSEP on the number of students who received CEIS services and the number of those students who then became IDEA eligible. The current IDEA grant application includes a CEIS reporting page for districts the used IDEA funds for CEIS purposes in FY16. The IDEA grant team has notified a few districts that did not complete the CEIS reporting page or have errors on the page. Please provided the federal reporting data or correct the errors as soon as possible, but no later than **February 15, 2017**.

Directors Listsery Announcements

The grant team asks that directors share the listserv announcements and encourage staff to read those emails. The listserv announcements are the quickest and easiest method for mass dissemination of grant information and updates.

Assessment Updates

SAT

- Districts were sent communication regarding their Attendance Identifier (AI) for testing. This had to be done in order for students to get a label for test day.
- Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) coordinator should begin the
 process of requesting accommodations through College Board. Deadline for
 SSD coordinators to submit College Board approved accommodations requests
 need to be completed by February 15, 2017.
- Manuals for test day and SSD coordinator are posted on the ISBE website under SAT.
- Special education coordinators and teachers need to be aware that if a student gets one state allowed accommodation, the student will not receive a college reportable score.
- SAT will be delivered in paper/pencil format

PARCC

- Students in grades 3-8 will be assessed via computer or paper.
- New PARCC accessibility feature and accommodation form is posted.
- Students who need assistive technology, color contrast, text-to-speech for mathematics, or human reader/signer for mathematics is available to everyone. However, it still needs to be identified in the PARCC Pre-ID.

DLM-AA

- Students have been uploaded into DLM.
- Data lockdown started on February 6, 2017.
- District test coordinators can still create rosters, add/update users, and complete the first contact survey.
- Students who need to be enrolled into DLM, districts will need to go to the DLM
 website to access the Illinois page to get the enrollment template to upload
 students into Educator Portal. The template will be sent to ISBE via send ISBE a
 file.
- The testing window opens on March 15, 2017.
