# TEACH Illinois, Jason Helfer, Executive Director of Teaching and Learning, Illinois State Board of Education

Dr. Helfer gave an overview of what Teach Illinois is and the direction they are going. Dr. Helfer identified several steps and recommendations from outside entities/constituents. ISBE is working with partners across the state to: 1) Coordinate a statewide campaign to elevate the teaching profession and inspire young people, especially those of color, to join the profession, 2) Incentivize and create opportunities for P12 and postsecondary institutions to work together to create streamlined pathways into the teaching profession, 3) Support partnerships between school districts and teacher preparation programs in order to closely align teacher supply and demand, 4) Develop innovative, results-based approaches to educator preparation, 5) Develop and adopt a research-based bar for licensure that leads to a highly effective and diverse workforce, 6) Promote teacher leadership and career pathways with differentiated responsibilities and appropriate incentives and 7) Develop robust teacher mentorship and induction programs.
