The closing date for FY 23 Farm to School Grant applications is Jan. 6, 2023. The U.S. Department of Agriculture will award up to \$12 million in competitive grants to eligible entities through the Farm to School Grant Program in Fiscal Year 2023. ## SY 24 Annual Order Period Opens Jan. 9

he School Year 2023-24 annual order period for the Food Distribution Program opens Jan. 9. The three spending options include, USDA Foods, DOD Fresh, and diversion to processors.

The diversion to processors option will close in in the Illinois Commodity System from Feb. 20 to Feb. 24, so that ISBE Nutrition Department staff can compile truck loads. It will reopen Feb. 27 for final changes. All diversion to processor requests are

due by March 6.

### VSR Deadline is Dec. 15

he deadline for completion Report is Dec. 15.

All School Nutrition Programs sponsors who collected Household Eligibility Applications from July 1 to Oct. If you do need assistance, we have 1, 2022, must conduct the Verification process and complete the VSR in WINS.

Please note that sponsors in Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) districtwide do not collect HEAs so they do not have to complete the Verification process or submit the VSR.

We hope everyone is on pace with the Verification process to meet the deadline for the annual report. If you have not started the Verification Frequently Asked Questions docuprocess, you will want to ASAP be-

cause it takes some time after the of the Verification Summary initial Oct. 1 count to send notices to households and to proceed with the necessary follow-up and final notices.

**Know the Requirements for School Districts** 

ublic Act 096-0734 (amends Public Act 095-0155), amends Section 20 of the Childhood Hunger Relief Act (105 ILCS 126/20). This amendment requires a school district to implement a summer breakfast and/or lunch program for the duration of the summer school program in all schools where 50 percent or more of the student population is eligible for free or reduced-price meals AND that have a summer school program.

This amendment applies to all schools that meet the above criteria, including those schools not currently participating in any federal Child Nutrition Program. There is an opt-out clause in the legislation, but it must be completed by Jan. 15.

### **Important Dates to Remember**

**Jan. 15:** Deadline to submit written Opt-Out Request to your regional superintendent of schools.

**Feb. 15:** Deadline to develop and keep on file the district plan to conduct a summer lunch and/or breakfast program for each school where at least 50 percent of the students are eligible for free or



reduced-price school meals AND that have a summer school program.

**Prior to March 1:** Regional superintendent of schools must convene a public hearing to hear testimony from the school district and interested community members.

March 1: Deadline for regional superintendent to:

- Inform the school district, in writing, of his or her decision, along with the reasons why the exemption was granted or denied.
- Provide a listing to the Nutrition Department of all districts that applied to opt-out, along with the affected schools, whether the exemption was granted or denied, and the reasons for the action.

Public Act 096-0734 requires all school districts in Illinois planning to operate an academic summer school or enrichment program in a building with 50 percent or more of the students eligible for free or reduced-price meals must operate a summer feeding program for at least the duration of the program.

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information (e.g., Braille, large print, audiotape, American Sign Language), should contact the responsible state or local agency that administers the program or USDA's TARGET Center at (202) 720-2600 (voice and TTY) or contact USDA through the Federal Relay Service at (800) 877-8339.

The letter must contain the complainant's name, address, telephone number, and a written description of the alleged discriminatory action in sufficient detail to inform the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights (ASCR) about the nature and date of an alleged civil rights violation. The completed AD-3027 form or letter must be submitted to USDA by:
