Food Handler and Allergy Trainings

USDA MEMO

On Nov. 1, the USDA Food and Nutrition Service issued a memo regarding fees for electronic payment services in the School Nutrition Programs. This does not take effect until School Year 2027-28. This memorandum clarifies policy related to fees associated with electronic payments in the school meal programs and ensures students who are determined eligible for free or reduced price meal benefits receive the benefits they qualify for without having to pay additional fees. The memo states families with students eligible for free or reduced price meals must not be charged any fees along with the cost of a meal, including fees for using electronic payment services.

Verification Summary Report Deadline Dec. 15

On Nov. 1, Steps 2-5 of the VSR opened in WINS. (View the <u>VSR Steps</u> <u>2-5 training</u>.) Nov. 15 marked the completion of the Verification process. You then have until Dec. 15 to submit your VSR.

The VSR must be submitted in WINS to avoid claim withholding.

If you have not started Verification or need assistance, please start by watching the "Verification Process for School Year 2024-25" training, which is available on the <u>SNP Training and</u> <u>Professional Standards webpage</u>.

Sponsors should also be familiar with the <u>SNP Administrative Handbook</u> (Section I is on Verification).

All School Nutrition Program sponsors participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and/or School Breakfast Program (SBP) who receive and approve Household Eligibility Applications between July 1 to Oct. 1, 2024, must conduct Verification. (Sponsors that are district-wide Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) do not need to complete the Verification process or the VSR.)

USDA Seeks Applicants for Farm to School Grants

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is seeking applications for the **2025 Patrick Leahy Farm to School Grants**.

Applications are due by Jan. 10. Get started by learning more at <u>https://www.fns.usda.gov/f2s/grant</u>.

K-12 schools nationwide serve meals to about 30 million children every school day. These meals provide critical nutrition to children and the foundation for our nation to have a healthier future. And when local foods are incorporated into school

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meals, it boosts nutrition, strengthens supply chains, and supports farmers and producers across America.

Earlier this year, USDA awarded the 2024 Farm to School Grants, a record-breaking \$14.3 million for 154 projects in 43 states, the District of Columbia, Guam, and Puerto Rico. These investments will help 1.9 million children eat more tasty, nutritious foods in school, while supporting farmers and producers in their local and regional communities.

Know the Requirements for School Districts

Public Act 096-0734 (amends Public Act 095-0155), amends Section 20 of the Childhood Hunger Relief Act (105 ILCS 126/20). This amendment requires a school district to implement a summer breakfast and/or lunch program for the duration of the summer school program in all schools where 50 percent or more of the student population is eligible for free or reduced-price meals AND that have a summer school program.

This amendment applies to all schools that meet the above criteria, including those schools not currently participating in any federal Child Nutrition Program. There is an optout clause in the legislation, but it must be completed by Jan. 15.

Important Dates to Remember

Jan. 15: Deadline to submit written Opt-Out Request to your regional superintendent of schools.

Feb. 15: Deadline to develop and keep on file the district plan to conduct a summer lunch and/or breakfast program for each school where at least 50 percent of the students are eligible for free or reduced-price school meals AND that have a summer school program. Prior to March 1: Regional superintendent of schools must convene a public hearing to hear testimony from the school district and interested community members.

March 1: Deadline for regional superintendent to:

- Inform the school district, in writing, of their decision, along with the reasons why the exemption was granted or denied.
- Provide a listing to the Nutrition Department of all districts that applied to opt-out, along with the affected schools, whether the exemption was granted or denied, and the reasons for the action.

April 1: Deadline for the Illinois State Superintendent of Education to hear appeals on the decisions of regional superintendents of schools.

Public Act 096-0734 requires all school districts in Illinois planning to operate an academic summer school or enrichment program in a building with 50 percent or more of the students eligible for free or reduced-price meals must operate a summer feeding program for at least the duration of the program.
