ANNUAL ORDER TIME UNDER WAY

he School Year 2022-2023 annual order period for the Food Distribution Program opened Jan. 3. The three spending options include USDA Foods, DOD Fresh, and diversion to processors.

The diversion to processors option will close in the Illinois Commodity System from Feb. 21 to Feb. 25, so that ISBE Nutrition Department staff can compile truck loads. It will re-open Feb. 28 for final

changes. All diversion to processor requests are due by March 4.

We understand that the continuing pandemic and supply chain disruptions will make it difficult to forecast your needs for next year. However, USDA has kept their order dates consistent with prior years, therefore, states must keep their order dates consistent.
