APPLICATION AVAILABLE FOR LFS FUNDING

The Local Food for Schools (LFS) application is now available on your 2024 WINS homepage! For instructions click here.

LFS is funding from the U.S. Department of Agriculture through the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) that schools can use to purchase local unprocessed and minimally processed foods to serve in their meal programs. For more information view our "Introduction to Local Food for Schools" recorded webinar.

Who can participate?

All National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program participants are eligible!

If you are worried about where to source local foods from here are a couple of suggestions:

- Reach out to a local farmer in your area.
- Visit a local farmers market and talk to the vendors.
- Contact the Illinois Farm to School Network.
- Visit the <u>Market Maker website</u> to find sources online or view our training.
- Reach out to your local county Farm Bureau.
- Check with your county <u>University of Illinois Extension</u> office.
- Talk to your current DoD provider or your mainline distributor.
- Talk to your food service management company, vended meals provider, or school that provides you with your meals.

If you are concerned about what the procurement requirements might be, check out this procurement information:

- 89% of SFAs are automatically eligible to use the micro purchase procurement method (receiving less than \$10,000), which means the SFA can just choose who to purchase from as long as the price is reasonable. Click here for a <u>listing of SFA allotments</u>.
- Of the remaining 11% that are not automatically eligible to use the micro purchase, a large majority will still be eligible to use the micro purchase method. Review our <u>LFS Procurement Flowchart</u> to help you determine if your LFS purchase are eligible for the micro purchase method.
- If your SFA does not meet the micro purchase method of procurement, reach out to our staff and we would be happy to assist you: localfoods@isbe.net.

If you don't think you have the time to source the local foods and prepare them:

- A majority of our SFAs are receiving enough funding to do maybe 1-3 purchases.
- There is a large timeline for using the funds. The funds can be used anytime between August 2023 all the way to January 2025.
- If you are worried about staff time, pick an item/items that don't require much prep work, like apples or veggies for your salad bar.
- Think outside of the traditional fruits and vegetables what about local rice, or local yogurt or cheese, or what about local beef for burgers or sausage for breakfast sandwiches?

TEAM NUTRITION WEB QUIZZES

Let's see how much you know about Child Nutrition (CN) labels with Team Nutrition's latest web quiz! The Child Nutrition Label Quiz helps operators identify products that may need a CN label and understand the requirements for accepting CN labeled products. The quiz consists of 10 self-paced questions that provide feedback for correct and incorrect answers. This quiz was created to support the information found in the CN Labeling Program and Food Buying Guide for Child Nutrition Programs.

PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS

Users now have an option to add an associated certification to training logs for recurring trainings or courses that result in a certification. By using the new "Log Certifications" feature, the <u>Professional Standards</u> Training Tracker Tool (PSTTT) will send an email reminder 90 and 30 days before the certification expiration date.

An additional option is now available to log certifications separate from training hours. This feature could be used for new hires that may have completed a certification course prior to their hire date. Contact cnpntab@usda.gov with any questions or feedback.

REMINDER: SNP Annual Application

The School Nutrition Programs (SNP) application for School Year 2023-24 is available in the Web-Based Illinois Nutrition System (WINS). Sponsors should complete the application by June 30, 2023. Please disregard this reminder if you have completed this annual renewal.

The application is an annual requirement for all sponsors to participate in such programs as the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP), After School Snack Program, Special Milk Program, and Illinois Free Lunch and Illinois Breakfast. Please note that if you are participating in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), this annual application is still necessary to finalize participation plans in the meal programs for the upcoming school year.

All sponsors should first view the recorded training, as there are some new steps in the application and some of the information has changed for Program Year 2024. We ask sponsors to follow the instructions carefully to minimize wait times for assistance.

Healthy School Meals for All Programs

There have been a lot of guestions about the Healthy School Meals for All Program (House Bill 2471).

The proposal is subject to appropriation. This means that School Food Authorities participating in the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program may be able to get additional state reimbursement to make all meals no charge for all students if enough funding for the Healthy School Meals for All Program is approved by state lawmakers. This funding was not provided in the new state fiscal year (July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024).

Federal requirements for the School Nutrition Programs (NSLP, SBP, etc.) remain the same. Sponsors in the National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, and other School **Nutrition Programs should** continue operations as normal. This includes completing the required annual application in WINS. Watch for updated Household Eligibility Resources in June.

Meet the 2023 Champion!

The Illinois State Board of Education Nutrition Department is excited to announce the 2023 ISBE School Nutrition Champion. This year's award goes to **Katie Ford, the head cook for Shaw**-



Katie Ford started as an assistance cook in 2017 and has been the head cook since 2020 for Shawnee CUSD 84.

nee CUSD 84 in Wolf Lake. Katie was first hired as an assistant cook in May 2017. The district has one kitchen that serves three schools, Shawnee Elementary School, Shawnee Jr. High School, and Shawnee High School.

Katie was nominated by Shawnee CUSD 84 Superintendent Shelly Clover-Hill. In her nominating submission, she wrote:

"When Katie took over as head cook in 2020, she made it her mission to improve our school meals and that is still true today. She actively seeks

the input of the students and staff in the development of the menus Katie takes great pride in offering meals that will be eaten and not thrown in the garbage. She is also a master at getting the students to try new foods and adds those menu items when the vast majority of students ask for it again."

Some of the best practices and accomplishments highlighted in the nomination credited to Katie's hard work and leadership included:

- Lunchroom participation in holidays and special events such as Halloween, Homecoming Week, and FFA Week. "Katie and the two assistant cooks can also be counted on to participate in all of the fun school activities ... They are known to randomly dress up or make meals to go along with a theme such as green eggs and ham for Dr. Seuss Week."
- The district was awarded a School Lunch Rocks grant from the Jackson County Health Department.
- With grant funding, the district purchased a salad bar station and they plan on having it up and running for the 2023-24 school year.
- Exterior walk-in cooler and freezer upgrades: "For dec-

ades, we could not afford new units. Luckily, this year we were able to purchase a walk-in cooler and freezer with Katie's assistance. She made sure the new units would fit our needs now and in the future."

To file a program discrimination complaint, a Complainant should complete a Form AD-3027, USDA Program Discrimination Complaint Form which can be obtained online at: https://www.usda.gov/sites/default/files/documents/USDA-OASCR%20P-Complaint-Form-0508-0002-508-11-28-17Fax2Mail.pdf, from any USDA office, by calling (866) 632-9992, or by writing a letter addressed to USDA. The letter must contain the complainant's name, address, telephone number, and a written description of the alleged discriminatory action in sufficient detail to inform the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights (ASCR) about the nature and date of an alleged civil rights violation.
