FUNDING OPPORTUNITY

Apply for the Fresh Fruit & Vegetable Program

he Illinois State Board of Education Nutrition Department is accepting applications for eligible schools to participate in the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program in School Year 2023-24.

The Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program is a federally assisted program providing free fresh fruits and vegetables to children at eligible elementary schools during the school day. The goal of the FFVP is to introduce children to fresh fruits and vegetables, to include new and different varieties, and to increase overall acceptance and consumption of fresh, unprocessed produce among children. The FFVP also encourages healthier school environments by promoting nutrition education.

Program Eligibility: Schools participating in the National School Lunch Program that have 50% or greater free and reduced-price eligibility percentage and serve students enrolled in grades 8 or below are eligible to apply.

Schools with the highest free and reduced-price eligibility.

Schools with the highest free and reduced-price eligibility percentage have the greatest chance of being selected for the program.

Application Submission and Deadline: Sponsors with eligi-

ble schools that wish to participate should access the FFVP Application link in the sponsor tasks tab in their Program Year 2023 School Nutrition Programs Application in WINS and refer to the <u>application instructions</u>. **FFVP applications must be completed no later than April 14, 2023,** for con-

sideration. Sponsors will be notified via email, within approximately 90 days from the application deadline, on whether their schools are selected for the program. If selected, schools must be prepared to begin the program at the start of School Year 2023-24.

School Selection: Selection of schools for participation in FFVP is determined by priority given to elementary schools with the highest free and reduced-price eligibility percentage.

Schools that have the same free and reduced-price eligibility percentage are ranked from lowest to highest enrollment to allow the maximum number of schools to be allocated funding. Funding for this program is limited. The number of schools selected will depend on the amount of funding provided for the program year.

Local Health Department Reviews

ach school year SFAs must obtain two food sanitation inspections for each site where food is prepared or served. For most counties, the local health department will conduct such inspections. If the SFA is in a county that does not have a local health department, then the SFA must contact neighboring county health departments to conduct food sanitation inspections.

Copies of these inspections must be maintained at the SFA or at the site for three years plus the current year. The most recent

food sanitation report must be posted in a prominent location that is viewable by the general pub-

If an SFA has not received the food sanitation inspections by March 31, a letter must be written to the local health department requesting the required two food sanitation inspections for each site where food is prepared or served. The letter

must be maintained at the SFA or at each site as documentation of your attempt to comply with two food inspections as required by USDA regulations.

New Contract Renewal Forms Distributed


his reminder is for sponsors who currently have a food service management company (FSMC) contract or vended meals contract that contains the option to renew the existing contract at least one more year. If you are conducting a new procurement instead of renewing your contract or you do not have such type of contract you may disregard this notice.

The Illinois State Board of Education Nutrition Department recently emailed the required Contract Renewal Agreement Form and instructions directly to the Authorized Representative listed in the Web-Based Illinois Nutrition System (WINS). If you have not received the form, please contact Christina Smith at nutritionprocurement@isbe.net to obtain a copy. Please do not use old renewal forms.

All contracts must be renewed prior to their expiration, generally June 30 or July 31, 2023. Please submit your Contract Renewal Agreement Form along with all required documentation to nutritionprocurement@isbe.net prior to the current contract expiration.
