Sign Up for In-Person Verification Trainings

School food authorities (SFAs) participating in the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program are required to verify income for a small percentage of households approved for free or reduced-price meals each school year.

ISBE staff want to help prepare you as a sponsor with HEAs to understand Verification steps and process.

We are offering in-person trainings at several locations throughout the state. Please register to attend a training in your area.

purchase local unprocessed or minimally processed foods to serve as part of the NSLP and/or SBP reimbursable meals. The funding is available from August 2023 through January 2025.
