Highlights of School Year 2009-2010

Illinois School Foodservice and Nutrition Making Illinois Proud

As school year (SY) 2009–2010 ends, it is appropriate to reflect on the highlights of this year's activities of Illinois schools and ISBE's Nutrition Program division as follows:

- The 3rd Annual Illinois School Wellness . . . From A to Z Conference was held May 4, 2010, recognizing school wellness efforts, from Addison to Zion, Ill.
- 31 schools received School Breakfast Program Start-Up Grants of up to \$3,500.
- 54 schools initiated School Breakfast Programs (SBP).
- 36 trainings were conducted statewide by ISBE Nutrition Programs staff covering food safety, the Dietary Guidelines for

Expect School Year 10-11 Household Eligibility Application Online

The Household Eligibility Application for free and reduced-price meals for the school year 2010-2011

will be posted on our Web site (www.isbe.net/nutrition) in June. All forms used in prior years to create copies for distribution should be discarded. The new application form must be used. Program regulations require schools to distribute free and reduced-price Household Eligibility Applications no earlier than four calendar weeks prior to the time the students start school. Schools cannot send letters home at the end of the current school year for the next school year nor can the schools begin accepting and processing applications before July 1 annually.

Electronic Direct Certification Process

Direct certification is a simplified method of determining student's eligibility for free meals through the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs or free milk under the Special Milk Program without completing a Household Eligibility Application. In addition, students directly certified to receive free meals or milk are not subject to verification. Direct certification is required by regulations for all Local Educational Agencies (LEA).

The Electronic Direct Certification System used last school year will be implemented statewide again. For all public school district LEAs, the annual file for school year 2010-2011 will be posted on or near July 1, 2010. It is best if you access this file as close to that time as you can and certify all matches that you can before the distribution of the Household Eligibility Applications to households. This will simplify the processing of duplicate Household Eligibility Application and Direct Certification benefits.

The free eligibility status of child(ren) located through the Electronic Direct Certification System, to the extent possible, must be extended to any child(ren) within the same family that are enrolled in your district. For example, if a household has children located in the Electronic Direct Certification System and some not, then those children that are members of the same family, to the extent that the LEA knows that they are within the same family, may be listed on that Direct Certification Notification Letter. Households in which at least one child is directly certified and all children in that household are part of the same family do not need to be provided the Household Eligibility Application. For this purpose "family" is defined by the USDA as "a group of related or nonrelated individuals who are not residents of an institution or boarding house, but who are living as one economic unit." ISBE is working on system enhancements to the Electronic Direct Certification System. Questions and Answers

Can a school menu a smoothie (1 c. yogurt, ½ cup juice, and ½ c fruit) and credit this item as three components?

A. No. Section B, Question #2 of the Alternative Protein Product guidance means that the meat/meat alternate component cannot be consumed in a beverage. Smoothies can only contribute the creditable volume of fruit and/or fruit juice. As such, only one of the F/V servings required for food based menu planning can be fulfilled in a smoothie.

Make Your Plans for Summer Meals

All schools in Illinois with 50 percent or more of the students eligible for free or reduced-price meals AND that have a summer school program, must operate a summer feeding program in summer 2010. Public Act 095-0155, which was recently amended by Public Act 096-0734 (effective August 25, 2009), amends the Childhood Hunger Relief Act (105 ILCS 126/20). This amendment requires a school district

that meets the above requirements to implement a summer breakfast and/or lunch program for the duration of the summer school program.

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) and the Seamless Summer Option are the two federal nutrition programs school food authorities may choose to operate. Schools affected by this law must serve children in the summer school program and those from the community between the ages of 1 and 18 years.

Workshops are offered throughout Illinois to train SFAs on the requirements of SFSP. Be sure to make plans to attend a workshop this spring if you participate in SFSP so you will be ready to open your doors and serve breakfast and/or lunch to the children in your area. There is no fee to attend the workshops, but registration is required. Dates and registration information for the workshops can be found at http://www.isbe.net/nutrition/htmls/work-shops.htm.

End-of-Year Reminders

With the end of the school year quickly approaching, don't forget to file your monthly claims for reimbursement by the 10th day of the following month. In

addition, all claims for June and prior must be received by July 31 in order to be included in the year end proration payment for Illinois Free funding. Claims for June and prior that are not received by July 31 may not receive Illinois Free funding.

Also remember that you can no longer combine June claims with May, nor August with September. A separate claim must be submitted for each month regardless of the number of serving days.

Now is the time to go check your site applications to ensure that the site is correctly marked for participation in June. You can check this through the online Application and Claim Entry System (ACES) by looking at Section H of the online application, "Months of Operation." If the site is not marked for June and should be, just click on the box and submit. If the site is marked but will not serve any meals in June, please uncheck the box and submit so that we have accurate counts to report to USDA.

School Year 2011 Deliveries

School Year 2011 will begin with August 2010 deliveries. Schools will be able to go on ICS and look at the commodities allocated to them for this first delivery period on July 13, 2010. During the period July 13 through July 20, changes can be made to the allocation if needed. Also, please be sure to check the delivery schedule located on the Food Distribution homepage at http://www.isbe.net/business.htm to find out when your first delivery of SY2011 will be. If your scheduled delivery date for August 2010 is before you will be in session or before you need commodities, be sure to mark "Do Not Deliver" during the July 13-20 adjustment period. Have a great summer and be sure to contact the Food Distribution Program at 217/782-2491 if you have any questions.

Double Check Your Processing Orders

If you have not heard from any processor you have diverted commodities to by the July 13th – 20th adjustment period mentioned above, you need to contact those processors and confirm your orders for the 2011 school year. If you do not have a contact name and number for any processor, the contact information is available on the Food Distribution Program Web site, http://www.isbe.net/business.htm and select the *USDA Approved National Processors List* link.

Expanding Breakfast Grant Application Due Date, May 7

The Midwest Dairy Council's 2010 Competitive Expanding Breakfast grants will assist grantees to implement nontraditional breakfast services such as Breakfast in the Classroom, Grab 'n Go Breakfast, Breakfast after 1st period, and Universal Breakfast. Awards of up to \$2,500 are available for a full year program or up to \$1,000 for a pilot program (30 days, minimum) in school year 2011. Maximum award is \$10,000 per district. Workshops Scheduled: Developing a School Food Safety Plan

All schools are required to have a food safety plan in place. The *Developing a School Food Safety Plan* workshop will help schools ensure that they have the plan developed. Participants will be introduced to the Process Approach to Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point Principles (HACCP), which allows for a more practical application of food safety procedures. Participants will receive information and work with hands-on activities they can take back to their schools and immediately use in the development of a food safety plan or revision of a current food safety plan.


