To ensure you are receiving the latest information regarding your school nutrition programs, please ensure that your contact information listed in WINS is accurate.

There are three contacts on your main Dashboard in WINS:

- Authorized Representative This information is pulled directly from Entity Profile System (EPS) which is the master list of district superintendents (public schools) and head administrator (non-public schools). If this information is not correct, please log into IWAS, click System Listings (on the left), select EPS, then request appropriate changes.
 Note: The Authorized Representative information is not just for the school nutrition programs, it is the used by the entire Illinois State Board of Education for various programs and funding and must be the district superintendent (public schools) or the head administrator that is financially and legally responsible for the entire school or school district (non-public schools). If you need assistance regarding the Authorized Representative please contact Data Analysis and Accountability at 217-782-3950.
- Sponsor Contact This can be whomever you choose. We recommend it be someone other than the Authorized Representative. If you wish to change the person currently listed, send an email to cnp@isbe.net with ALL of the following information: name, title, phone, fax and email. The change will be reflected in WINS in 7-10 business days.
- Sponsor Claim Contact This can be whomever you choose. We recommend it be someone other than the Authorized Representative and Sponsor Contact. If you wish to change the person currently listed, send an email to cnp@isbe.net with ALL of the following information: name, title, phone, fax and email. The change will be reflected in WINS in 7-10 business days.

There are **two contacts** for each of your sites as well:

- Principal This information is pulled directly from Entity Profile System (EPS) which is the
 master list of principals or head administrators. If this information is not correct, please log into
 IWAS, click System Listings (on the left), select EPS, then request appropriate changes.
 Note: This information is not just for the school nutrition programs, it is the used by the entire
 Illinois State Board of Education for various programs and funding. If you need assistance
 regarding the Authorized Representative please contact Data Analysis and Accountability at

- **Site Contact** This can be whomever you choose. We recommend it be someone other than the Principal. If you wish to change the person currently listed, send an email to cnp@isbe.net with ALL of the following information: name, title, phone, fax and email. The change will be reflected in WINS in 7-10 business days.

If you find your contact information in WINS is accurate, but you have still not received an email from cnp@isbe.net in the last month, you will want to change your email settings to allow emails from cnp@isbe.net to come through. Overview of the Administrative Review Process

This ½ day training will provide sponsors an overview of the Administrative Review (AR) including all USDA checklists and resources. The Administrative Review is an assessment conducted by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) of the School Food Authority's (SFA) administration of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP) and other school nutrition programs. The objectives of the AR are to determine whether the SFA meets program requirements, provide technical assistance, secure any needed corrective action, and assess fiscal action, if applicable. ISBE must conduct ARs of all SFAs participating in the NSLP and/or SBP at least once during each three-year review cycle period. The first three-year review cycle began SY2013-2014.

The Green Lunchroom Challenge Kick Off

The **Green Lunchroom Challenge** is a voluntary competition among schools to improve the sustainability of their food service operation.



Schools can choose to participate in a range of activities that best suit their situation, budget, and available community resources. Participants will earn points for every activity they complete and relative progress will be displayed on an online leaderboard. Resources and guidance are available on the challenge website and from Illinois Sustainable Technology Center (ISTC) technical assistance staff for each recommended activity.

Schools may also choose to integrate food waste prevention and reduction into curricula, helping students learn about food security and hunger, composting, the circular economy, and stewardship.

On Earth Day 2016, the participating public K-12 school with the most points will be publicly recognized as the winner and receive a prize (to be determined) to foster continuous improvement.

A free kick-off workshop on the challenge is scheduled for Sept. 17 at the ISTC in Champaign. For more information, visit www.greenlunchroom.org/?methodName=findWorkshop. Workshop registration is limited to 40 participants. Please note that schools do NOT need to participate in the workshop in order to participate in the challenge itself.
