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IMPORTANT! SY13-14 Annual Sponsor/Site Applications due October 15, 2013

Schools wishing to participate in any School-Based Child Nutrition Program (National School Lunch, School Breakfast, Special Milk, After School Snacks and IL Free) must submit an application electronically each year by logging into IWAS and using the Webbased Illinois Nutrition System (WINS).

If you are new to our programs this school year and wish to claim July, August, and/or September, you must submit an application under School Year 2013 as soon as possible. (Schools participating in our programs in SY12-13 are covered under their current application through September 30, 2013.)

Any school wishing to participate in our programs October 1, 2013 and beyond - must submit an application under Program Year 2014 (covering October 1, 2013-September 30, 2014).

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Verification Completion Deadlines

Each year local education agencies are required to have completed verification activities no later than November 15 in preparation for completing the online verification summary report that is due December 15.

Verification Timeline:

 October 1—Count number of approved applications on file by category, and begin verification process. Applications to be counted are those that were approved for free or reduced benefits based on income, foster, or a SNAP or TANF ID number being provided on the application. This count should be taken no later than the close of business on October 1.

Prior to doing the application count, LEAs are required access the Electronic Direct Certification system to directly certify as many students as possible. LEAs should also try to directly certify students whose current eligibility status for free or reduced price meals was based on the use of a household eligibility application. **Any students that can be transferred to direct certification status** should not have their household eligibility application included in the October 1, application count because they would then be considered to a directly certified student.

- Last operating day of October—Count number of ALL free and reduced-price eligible students by category. This information will be needed when the Verification Summary Report (VSR) is completed. ALL schools in the National School Lunch Program (including Provision and CEO schools) will need to be prepared to provide student counts.
- November 15—Ensure verification process is complete.
- December 15—Deadline to submit VSR.

Verification efforts are not required:

- For children certified under the Direct Certification Process including children documented as eligible migrant, runaway, homeless, or Head Start
- For children in residential child care institutions(RCCIs) except for locations that have applications for day students attending the institution
- In schools only participating in the Special Milk Program
- In schools only participating in Illinois Free programs
- In schools in which all students are served with no separate charge for food service and no special cash assistance is claimed; i.e., non-pricing programs claiming only the paid rate of reimbursement
- In LEAs in which all schools participate in Provisions 1, 2, or 3, except in those years in which applications are taken for all students in attendance; i.e., the base year
- In LEAs in which all schools participate in the Community Eligibility Provision/Option

WINS has been rolled forward to Program Year 2014. August and September claims are still part of Fiscal/Program Year 2013. To find those months as well as the claims you previously filed for FY 2013, just go to the top of your dashboard in WINS and in the Program Year drop down box select 2013 and click on the Search button to the right of that drop down box. This will switch your Dashboard back to 2013 and those months will now be available. Once it is time for your October claim, you will start to use program year 2014.

Overview of the NEW Administrative Review Process SY2013-2014

The Administrative Review is an assessment conducted by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) of the School Food Authority's (SFA) administration of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP) and other school nutrition programs. The objectives of the Administrative Review are to determine whether the SFA meets program requirements, provide technical assistance, secure any needed corrective action, and assess fiscal action, if applicable.

ISBE must conduct Administrative Reviews of all SFAs participating in the NSLP and/or SBP at least once during each three-year review cycle period. The first three-year review cycle begins SY2013-2014. A <u>list of tentative SFAs that will be reviewed during SY2013-2014</u> as well as resource materials related to the Administrative Review are available online.

Beginning with SY2013-2014, the format of the Administrative Review will be updated. While the overall topics will remain similar from prior reviews, in some instances the manner in which the topic is reviewed will change and some new topics may be added. In order to provide our SFAs an overview of the NEW Administrative Review including all USDA checklists and resources, ISBE, Nutrition and Wellness Programs Division staff will host in-person as well as a webinar training on this topic.

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USDA Releases Nutrition Standards for All foods Sold in Schools - Interim Final Rule – Public Comments and ISBE Survey Request

On June 28, 2013, the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) issued an Interim Final Rule entitled "Nutrition Standards for All Foods Sold in School as Required by the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010." The competitive foods portion of the rule takes effect on July 1, 2014, the start of school year 2014-2015, as required by Section 208 (Sec. 208) of the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 (HHFKA). 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Illinois Awarded Team Nutrition Training Grant

The USDA has notified the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) that Illinois has been selected as a recipient of the 2013 Illinois Team Nutrition Training (TNT) Grant. The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) will administer the 2013 Illinois Team Nutrition Training (TNT) Grant, with the overarching goal of supporting Illinois schools and child care centers in increasing and enhancing wellness efforts to assist children to develop life-long healthy eating and physical activity behaviors. The 2013 TNT grant proposal comprises three initiatives:

- 1. The Illinois Child Care Wellness Advisory Council initiative will aim to identify the needs of child care centers to help them implement practical changes and wellness policies that align with the 2010 Dietary Guidelines for Americans at their child care facilities. The USDA Nutrition and Wellness Tips for Young Children: Provider Handbook will be used as a resource. ISBE has identified five strategies of wellness to provide guidance:
 - 1) Build a Healthy Plate
 - 2) Promote Water and Other Healthy Beverages
 - 3) Increase Active Play
 - 4) Limit Screen Time
 - 5) Focus on Food Safety

An advisory council of Illinois child care professionals and stakeholders will be convened to define wellness in Illinois child care facilities and identify the training, resource needs, barriers, and other issues related to implementing/enhancing the five strategies of wellness in child care.

- 2. The Illinois Child Care Wellness Subgrants initiative will award 15 subgrants totaling \$250,500 to multisite Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) sponsors to enhance or create wellness programs aimed at maintaining a healthier child care environment. ISBE will produce five guidance videos and a special Mealtime Minutes publication to promote best practices and success stories that result from use of the subgrant funds. Three one-day wellness workshops will be held for a total of 150 representatives of CACFP sponsors statewide and subgrants will be offered to workshop participants to assist with creation and/or enhancement of wellness efforts at their child care facilities. As part of the subgrant application, a self-assessment survey will be provided to each site to determine current needs and help set each facility's goals for enhanced nutrition and wellness. The survey will be re-administered at the end of the subgrant period to determine the progress of each site. Technical assistance will be provided throughout the grant period to ensure success of this pilot subgrant opportunity.
- 3. The *Illinois HealthierUS School Challenge (HUSSC) Partnership/Mentoring* initiative will increase the number of Illinois schools submitting successful HUSSC applications and increase the number of HUSSC-certified schools. Current HUSSC-certified schools will provide peer-based technical assistance to potential schools in underrepresented counties in central and southern Illinois, ultimately increasing the number of certified

schools from 205 in 21 school districts to 300 in 30 school districts. High schools will be targeted, as only 10 are currently HUSSC certified. Illinois will also conduct the first Illinois HUSSC Week in March 2015, partnering with Action for Healthy Kids-Illinois and the Illinois Regional Offices of Education.
