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Hello.

Equity means we are making sure that every single child has the tools and support they need to be successful. This not only includes preK-12 students, but also students who choose to move forward in pursuing a college degree. ISBE's Equity Statement reflects the belief that we must affirm the strengths and assets that students bring with them to the classroom in the form of their diverse abilities, background, and life experiences. Financial barriers have caused significant inequities in accessing college and has forced Illinois students to leave the state for postsecondary education. The Retention of Illinois

Students and Equity (RISE) Act (http://www.ilga.gov/legislation/publicacts/fulltext.asp?Name=101-0021), a new law that went into effect Jan. 1, allows more Illinois high school students to afford a college education by eliminating certain barriers.

For the first time in Illinois, eligible undocumented students and transgender students who are disqualified from federal financial aid will now be able to apply for all forms of state financial aid. Additionally, the RISE Act assists students who have lost state aid because they have surpassed the 75-credit hour limit on state Monetary Award Program grants before they are juniors. The RISE Act is in place to ensure equity for all college students who are residents of Illinois, encouraging students who are ineligible for federal aid or have to take additional courses to stay in Illinois and attend Illinois institutions of higher learning. Overall, the act is in place to create more equitable access to higher education for all Illinois students. Additional information and resources, including the Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid, are available from the Illinois Student Assistance Commission at www.ISAC.org (http://www.isac.org/).

Additionally, in a continued effort to support Illinois education professionals, Public Act 100-1078

(http://www.ilga.gov/legislation/publicacts/fulltext.asp?Name=100-1078) guarantees that applicants will not be denied a professional license issued by the Illinois State Board of Education based solely on citizenship or immigration status. This includes professional licenses for educators, school counselors, school social workers, school psychologists, school nurses, and speech-language pathologists. Please visit ISBE's Educator Licensure webpage (/Pages/Professional-Educator-License.aspx) to learn more about obtaining a professional license.

I strongly encourage you to share all of this information with your teachers, counselors, and communities to ensure all of our students and educators are supported in the path of their choosing.

Lastly, we recently lost an incredible advocate for transgender and LGBTQ equal rights. Alex McCray, who graduated from Williamsville High School and went on to attend Fontbonne University, received the American Civil Liberties Union's John R. Hammell Award for his contributions to fight for equal rights for Americans in 2017 and was named the Illinois Safe School Alliance Activist of the Year in 2016. Alex is remembered as a quiet but fierce trailblazer who strove to ensure resources and support for all students. He will be greatly missed.

NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS

2019-20 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL APPLICATION FOR RECOGNITION RENEWAL NOW AVAILABLE

The Nonpublic School Application for Recognition Renewal is now available in IWAS for completion and submission by currently recognized schools for the 2019-20 school year. This voluntary annual renewal of application information must be submitted via IWAS; paper applications will not be accepted. The window for applying will close on **March 6**. A User Guide is being prepared. It will be accessible from within the IWAS application when it is available for reference.

There are two prerequisites to completion of the application for renewal of recognition. Nonpublic schools seeking to renew recognition must have renewed their registration **AND** submitted their immunization data before they can submit the Nonpublic School Application for Recognition Renewal. Schools that failed to renew their registration via IWAS through the Nonpublic Registration Renewal Report (https://sec.isbe.net/iwas/asp/login.asp?js=true) must contact Dr. Gary Greene or Derreck Langwith at (217) 785-9998.

Schools that failed to complete the Student Health Data will need to log into the IWAS Student Health Data-Immunizations application to enter their data. This application is still open for data collection. Update the grades missing in the Immunization data application in your Entity Profile System.

This application may be submitted at any time.

CORONAVIRUS TRAVEL ADVISORY & GUIDANCE/FAQS FOR K-12 SCHOOLS

The coronavirus outbreak in China has affected more than 75,000 people worldwide, prompting the US. Department of State, (https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/traveladvisories/traveladvisories/china-travel-advisory.html) the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (https://www.nc.cdc.gov/travel/notices/warning/novel-coronavirus-china), and the World Health Organization (https://www.who.int/ith/2019-nCoV advice for international traffic/en/) to issue travel advisories recommending against traveling to China.

As a result, numerous schools and universities have canceled yearly field trips to China and study abroad programs.

ISBE's top priority is the safety and well-being of all of Illinois students and school staff. In the wake of the recently issued travel advisories, ISBE highly recommends that any anticipated or planned travel to China should be postponed to a future date or canceled and replaced with another trip.

HELP FEED CHILDREN WITH SUMMER MEALS: TRAININGS SCHEDULED

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) needs additional sponsors and sites to help fill gaps in access to healthy meals. School districts, local government entities, and nonprofits are encouraged to become a Summer Meals sponsor and/or site to provide free, healthy meals and snacks in areas where poor economic conditions exist. This program is federally funded through the U.S. Department of Agriculture and administered by ISBE.

SFSP sponsors manage and develop their own sites and receive federal reimbursement via ISBE to cover the administrative and operating costs of preparing and serving meals. School districts, local governments, and nonprofits can become sponsors and set up serving sites at schools, parks, recreation centers, resource centers, churches, summer camps, libraries, and other community locations. WORKSHOPS ON CEP AND ALTERNATIVE BREAKFAST SERVICE MODELS

The Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) is a non-pricing meal service option for schools and school districts in low-income areas. CEP allows high-poverty schools and districts to serve breakfast and lunch at no cost to all enrolled students without collecting household applications. Instead, schools that adopt CEP are reimbursed using a formula based on the percentage of students categorically eligible for free meals based on their participation in other specific means-tested programs, such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF).

This workshop will provide an overview of CEP requirements, share best practices, and outline the CEP application process, as well as highlight alternative breakfast model strategies.

- TODOS: Mathematics for All will recognize up to six Chicago-area students in grades 5-12 at a ceremony during the 2020 National Council of Teachers of Mathematics Centennial Meeting and Exposition in Chicago. Each student will receive a calculator donated by Texas Instruments and a certificate from TODOS. Nominating teachers of award winners will receive a one-year membership/extension in TODOS and a recognition certificate. To be eligible for TODOS Student Awards, students should be nominated by their mathematics teacher. Teachers may nominate a maximum of two students for the award. To best serve the mission of TODOS, a student nominated for an award must be a member of an underrepresented group in particular, Latina/o and should meet at least ONE of the eligibility criteria listed on the application. All applications for TODOS Student Awards (http://stemed.uchicago.edu/TODOSawardapp/) must be received on or before March 2.
