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Dear Colleagues:

Happy Teacher Appreciation Day, and Teacher Appreciation Week! I think we all know why it's scheduled for this time of year. Things tend to get hectic in May, when capstone projects are due, finals are looming, and everyone is distracted by spring fever. It's the perfect time to be reminded how much all your hard work matters!

I asked a few of my colleagues here to share stories of teachers who inspire them – in their own education, or the lives of their children.

Dr. Jennifer Kirmes, our executive director for teaching and learning, had an immediate answer, thanks to visiting Lick Creek CCSD #16 last week and dropping in on Kathryn

Carter's pre-K class. The students greeted Jen eagerly telling her about what they were learning, and were so enthusiastic about their morning exercise that Jen joined in. "It is clear that Mrs. Carter has cultivated a safe and playful environment where each child is accepted and encouraged," Jen says.

Krish Mohip, our deputy chief of operational education, says he is inspired by Maria Bacur, a third grade teacher who has taught two of his children at Fairview South District 72 in Skokie. When Krish's daughter Riley was sick or on quarantine, Ms. Bacur kept her on track with virtual instruction and even delivered materials to Riley at home. "On a daily basis she challenges her students, sets high expectations while helping them achieve them, and provides a loving classroom environment while doing so," he says. "She is a treasure to the school and to the profession."

Oriana Wilson, our executive director of programs, is inspired by a former colleague, Tania Miranda, an elementary teacher at a dual-language program in Chicago. She cares for the whole child and their family," Oriana says. "She makes her students feel at home, loved and supported. The children excel because it is not forced, it is appreciated."

Joanne Clyde, our director of multilingual services, is inspired by all the bilingual teachers she works with, especially their amazing ability to fulfill so many different roles – teaching multiple grade levels, to students speaking multiple different languages, in different locations (a classroom, the library, the cafetorium stage, the hallway), and translating documents for parents on a moment's notice. Joanne calls bilingual teachers "the unsung heroes!"

Dr. Brenda Dixon, our Research and Evaluation officer, was inspired by Sister Mary Ann Joseph, who was "tough as nails" regarding discipline and lessons, but also prone to singing, dancing, and cheering – tendencies that forged strong connections with students. She also insisted that students had pride in "our African roots and heritage, and that

Dr. Erica Thieman, our director of k-12 curriculum and instruction, has personal and poignant memories of a teacher who stepped in when she needed someone the most. "When I was in the third grade, my mom -- who was a high school chemistry and physics teacher -- passed away after battling cancer for six years," Erica says. "My teacher that year, Mrs. Wilma Kinder, helped me through that very challenging time. She and every teacher I had through the next few years helped me not only survive but also thrive. They were critical in shaping who I became as an educator."

And finally, Dr. Ernesto Matias, our Educational Officer at ISBE, says his sixth-grade teacher at Moss Elementary School is responsible for his position today. Donald Fumo "was very strict and tolerated no nonsense," Ernesto says. When Ernesto returned to Moss to interview for a job, Mr. Fumo was principal, and remembered Ernesto, hiring him on the spot. Then Mr. Fumo began stuffing his mailbox with leadership brochures, nudging Ernesto to become an administrator. He took that advice and rose through the ranks. He and Mr. Fumo still have dinner together every month.

I share these stories to remind you of how important your work is, how far the ripples extend from every small thing you do today. Few professions offer such regular opportunities to shape the future. Thank you for the positive future you inspire!

FISCAL YEAR 2023 MOEQUITY UPDATE

MOEquity specifies that Local Education Agencies (LEAs) receiving Elementary and Secondary School Education Relief (ESSER) funds under the American Rescue Plan Act must protect certain high-poverty schools from disproportionate reductions in state and local funding and staffing in fiscal years 2022 and 2023, as determined by federal guidelines. This requirement is intended to ensure schools serving large proportions of low-income students receive an equitable share of state and local funds.

The Certification of Exception will be available for FY 2023 for LEAs that will not implement an aggregate reduction in combined state and local per-pupil funding (i.e., are not facing overall budget reductions).

MOEquity requirements are waived in FY 2023 for all LEAs submitting this certification. Consistent with FY 2022 guidance, certain LEAs are fully exempt from MOEquity, including those with a single school, those with schools that serve non-overlapping grade-spans, or those with fewer than 1,000 students. LEAs that are neither exempt nor eligible for the Certification of Exception may choose to conduct the required fiscal and staffing equity tests, or they may petition the U.S. Department of Education for unique waivers due to exceptional or uncontrollable circumstances.

LEA leaders are encouraged to consider MOEquity requirements, including eligibility for the Certification of Exception, as they begin planning for their FY 2023 annual budget. LEAs can review an archive of ISBE's FY 2022 guidance, along with the most recent MOEquity Frequently Asked Questions (/Pages/covid19.aspx) under Federal Funding – ESSER. GRANT ACCOUNTABILITY AND TRANSPARENCY ACT

SAM.GOV UPDATE

ISBE is aware of recent delays at SAM.gov, which means that additional time is needed to validate and renew entity registrations. As such, ISBE encourages all grantees to review their SAM ID and account status at SAM.gov (https://sam.gov/content/home) as soon as possible.

Registrations must be renewed annually, and entities should begin the renewal process at least 12 weeks prior to expiration. Expired or invalid SAM accounts will delay the ISBE grant application process as ISBE will not approve FY 2023 grant applications nor will awards be made to grantees with expired SAM accounts. CURRICULUM EVALUATION TOOL

Attention administrators, curriculum specialists, and instructional coaches: Looking for an easy tool to help support best practices and continuous quality improvement, the selection of high-quality instructional materials, and the promotion of equity and diversity?

Look no further! ISBE, in partnership with Regional Offices of Education (ROEs), launched its first Capacity Builders on the Curriculum Evaluation Tool (CET) in October 2021. ISBE encourages districts to work with their local ROE or Intermediate Service Center (ISC) to use the tool to help identify areas in which the ROE or ISC can provide additional supports through professional learning. This tool supports curriculum evaluation, fosters meaningful discussions, and aids in the decision-making process about the selection of new materials as appropriate.

Districts or ROEs interested in using the CET are eligible to apply for reimbursement expenses incurred, such as stipends for teachers, substitute pay, costs associated with facilitating professional learning that pertains to the tool, or other consumable materials. To quality for reimbursements, a district or ROE must:
