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Dear Colleagues:

I hope you will join me in celebrating Computer Science Education Week (https://www.csedweek.org/)! 'Tis the season to inspire our students to consider careers in the exciting field of computer science.

Special congratulations go out to nine districts chosen to receive School STEAM Grant Program funds. This fund, which uses more than \$1 million in proceeds from a special scratch-off lottery ticket, was established (https://www.ilga.gov/legislation/publicacts/fulltext.asp?Name=101-0561&print=true&write=) to help make science, technology, engineering, art, and math (STEAM) programming available to low-income students in disadvantaged neighborhoods, with priority given to programs that provide hands-on experience or focus on recruiting young women to enter STEAM professions.

The nine districts awarded are: Paris Union School District 95, Rantoul City School District 137, Parkview School/Community CUSD 300, Berwyn North SD 98, Perry School/Community CUSD 300, East St. Louis School District 189, Chicago Public School District 299, Carlinville CUSD 1, and Elmwood Park CUSD 401. Congratulations!

I'm excited by the creative range of the projects proposed in these districts' applications. For example, Rantoul's plans include buying VR goggles, digital cameras, and photo editing software; new culturally-diverse STEAM-centered books for the classroom and "hallway libraries"; a Sisters in Science afterschool club; and professional development for STEAM teachers. Parkview District 300 has plans for a plethora of hands-on courses for exploring everything from architecture and engineering to healthy cooking, and even a percussion group for girls called Girls On The Drum (GOT Drum). Most awardees also plan to host summer STEAM camps, some specifically for girls.

These awesome programs remind us that to continue to expand computer science education in Illinois, we need computer science teachers. ISBE has expanded the pathways for current teachers, career changers, and industry professionals to earn licensure and help prepare the next generation of technology leaders:

- For currently licensed teachers to earn a subsequent endorsement (/Pages/Subsequent-Teaching-Endorsements.aspx) in computer science: 18 semester hours of coursework in computer science and a passing score on the content area test
- For industry professionals to teacher computer science in grades 5-12 with a Provisional Career and Technical Educator license (/Pages/career-technical-educator.aspx)with stipulations:
 - 8,000 hours of verified work experience or
 - 60 semester hours of coursework in computer science and 2,000 hours of verified work experience

• For career changers to earn their license while teaching with the Content Knowledge Pathway Short-Term Approval (/Pages/educator-licensure-approvals.aspx), valid for three years: bachelor's degree in teaching or any bachelor's degree including 32 semester hours of coursework in computer science, plus a passing score on the content area test

ASSESSMENT

ISBE SEEKING FEEDBACK TO IMPROVE STATEWIDE ASSESSMENT SYSTEM

ISBE is exploring improvements to the state assessment system. An important part of this process is collecting feedback from stakeholders across the state to help us identify the priorities and potential options for moving forward.

We have worked with our partners at the Center for Assessment to design a survey to collect feedback. There is also a short video with the survey that provides some important background information we think you'll find useful to complete the survey. It will take about 30 minutes to watch the video and respond to the survey

This survey is one part of a larger process. We are also meeting with stakeholders and plan to empanel some advisory groups in early 2022 before bringing recommendations to the State Board in spring 2022.

COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS

The national average high school student-to-counselor ratio currently is 464 to 1. This typically translates to only 38 minutes of advising for high school seniors in low-income communities. In Illinois, the average student-to-counselor ratio is even higher at 579 to 1. ISBE and OneGoal are collaborating to offer a statewide solution for postsecondary success. ISBE and OneGoal will collaborate with districts to identify and offer flexible, data-driven, and impactful partnership options best suited to a district's context in order to build the capacity of educators and provide robust one-on-one advising to students so that more institutions can equitably support their students' postsecondary aspirations.

Districts have until **Dec. 22** to submit their application (https://www.onegoalgraduation.org/isbe/) to join OneGoal's Postsecondary Leadership Series (https://www.onegoalgraduation.org/our-model/district-partnership-program/). The new services provide robust professional development and personalized coaching to improve college and career advising for all students. Leaders will engage in an analysis of postsecondary success strategies to diagnose gaps in their work and actively address those gaps with the support of peers and a OneGoal postsecondary expert.

SPANISH LANGUAGE ARTS STANDARDS NOW AVAILABLE

In Illinois, nearly 250,000 of our students are currently more proficient in Spanish than English. New research from the University of Chicago (https://consortium.uchicago.edu/sites/default/files/2021-09/English%20Learners%20in%20CPS-Sep2021-Consortium_1.pdf) provides a fresh reminder of how to help those students succeed: It shows that English learners who receive bilingual services – instruction that includes their native language rather than English-only immersion – acquire English at a faster rate, have better attendance, and achieve higher academic performance in the long run. To support those services, Illinois adopted new state standards for Spanish Language Arts.

Side-by-side Spanish and English versions of the new Spanish Language Arts standards are now available on the ISBE website (/Pages/English-Learners-Compliance-Monitoring.aspx). PDF versions are available for K-12 combined as well as for each grade individually. The standards help to elevate the rigor of Spanish instruction in our schools.
