Hello,

ISBE's vision is to create a state of whole, healthy children nested in whole, healthy systems supporting communities wherein all people are socially and emotionally healthy. I see the word "healthy" repeated twice in our mission statement, and that's because it's such an important part of education's greater role in supporting our major goals is to ensure that every school across Illinois offers a safe and healthy learning environment for all students.

A focus on student health is an essential part of creating that healthy environment. The Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) recently sent out a warning about e-cigarettes, or vaping, among teens. Vaping puts youngsters at risk for addiction and other health consequences, but unfortunately, 40 percent of 10th-graders think there is low- or no-risk of harm when using e-cigarettes. This is simply false, and our students need to know the real health risks they're facing. IDPH is getting information to schools, administrators, and families through whatever means we can. [Resources are available on the ISBE website \(/Pages/School-Health-Issues.aspx\)](#) to help talk with students and parents about the dangers of vaping and e-cigarette use.

Students must also be up to date on required vaccinations or have a valid waiver on file with the school district by the Oct. 15 immunization deadline. [Check out our website \(/Pages/School-Health-Issues.aspx\)](#) for more information on the requirements. This is also the perfect time of year to remind students and families of getting a flu shot. IDPH recommends everyone 6 months and older be vaccinated yearly to protect against the flu. [IDPH provides information about this](#) (<http://www.dph.illinois.gov/topics-services/diseases-and-conditions/influenza>), including a search feature to find a flu vaccine provider in your community.

Meanwhile, getting our students to and from school safely is always an important focus for school districts. Anyone interested in obtaining a Professional School Bus Driver License in Illinois must attend and pass an initial School Bus Driver Training class. Additionally, all professional school bus drivers with a valid permit must attend a refresher course. Regional Offices of Education statewide offer initial and refresher courses frequently. We want to give a special shoutout to hundreds of emergency workers who joined forces last week to focus on school safety. The Illinois Emergency Management Institute annual training summit, attracting more than 1,000 emergency managers, police officers, firefighters, public health staff, and many more – all dedicated to protecting our communities before, during, and after emergencies. This year's summit [focused heavily on school safety](#) (<https://newschannel20.com/news/local/hundreds-join-forces-to-shed-light-on-school-safety>) and the importance of both schools and first responders knowing the best ways to keep our students safe in emergencies. Thank you to everyone who took part in this important training and for your continued partnership to make every community – and every school – safe.

And finally, in the spirit of transparency, I wanted to let you all know that I have been writing an educational book with two co-authors for the past 10 years about the school districts where I served as an administrator and our journey to close the achievement gap. The book is now approaching publication. I disclosed my work to the vetting process for my selection as state superintendent. The book presents the perspectives and experiences of myself and my co-authors as individuals, not as representatives who speak for the state or for the two districts. I am donating the entirety of my share of the proceeds from the book. The book is dedicated to my father, a man who has elected to donate the proceeds to Catholic Charities in honor of him. UPDATE ON 5ESSENTIALS SURVEY OF LEARNING CONDITIONS

Schools across Illinois participated in the seventh annual 5Essentials Survey of Learning Conditions: Organizing Schools for Improvement this past academic year. The survey generates valuable data that districts can use to guide their ongoing efforts to improve schools and to offer students an excellent education. The survey is a tool that allows districts and the state to share data to inform parents and community members about a school's learning environment. The Illinois 5Essentials survey is administered online by [UChicago Impact](https://uchicagoimpact.org/our-offerings/5essentials) (<https://uchicagoimpact.org/our-offerings/5essentials>) at the University of Chicago on behalf of the Illinois State Board of Education.

Accessing the Survey Results

The reports for the 2018-19 survey administration can be accessed by visiting the [5Essentials website](https://5-essentials.org/) (https://5-essentials.org/) and searching by school ZIP code. Please note: Schools that have participated in an approved alternate survey will not be listed.

The 5Essentials Indicators

The Illinois 5Essentials Survey identifies five indicators that lead to improved outcomes for all students, including improved attendance and larger test scores.

The five indicators that positively affect school success are:

Research derived from the Five Essentials for School Success has proven that schools strong on at least three of the 5Essentials are 10 times more likely to achieve positive outcomes.

Looking Forward to the Coming Year

The 2019-20 survey window will start no sooner than Dec. 10, 2019, and end no later than Feb. 14, 2020. Participation in the 5Essentials or an approved alternate survey is required annually, as the survey is part of the non-academic indicators for accountability under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

As with last year, schools will need to log into IWAS and access the Survey of Learning conditions application to submit the contact details for the district survey coordinator. The district survey coordinator is the main point of contact for 5Essentials-related matters and is responsible for communicating with our partner, UChicago administration window. The superintendent will be assigned to the role if a district coordinator is not nominated. Furthermore, any district seeking to participate in an approved alternate survey will need to submit the notification in the IWAS application and mail/email a copy of the letter of intent to ISBE **by Sept. 30**, 2019. Both the online form and physical letter of intent will result in the districts' auto-enrollment into the 5Essentials survey for the 2019-20 school year. SUPPORTING TRANSGENDER STUDENTS

This update is one component of ISBE's concerted plan to ensure that Illinois schools are an inclusive and affirming environment for transgender, nonbinary, and gender nonconforming individuals. ISBE is committed to ensuring that Illinois schools are safe and welcoming spaces that support all students and ensure that all students, including transgender, nonbinary, and gender nonconforming students --, like all other students -- are fully supported in Illinois schools. Disparate treatment of transgender, nonbinary, and gender nonconforming individuals in Illinois public schools is not only detrimental to the students, it also violates state and federal law.

Executive Order 19-11 establishes an Affirming and Inclusive Schools Task Force to examine best practices for supporting transgender, nonbinary, and gender nonconforming students in schools and make recommendations to the Governor. The task force is expected to deliver a report to the Office of the Governor by Jan. 1, 2020, which will include a list of legal rights, a description of best practices and any findings, and recommendations to ensure that transgender, nonbinary, and gender nonconforming students are fully supported in Illinois schools. In addition, pursuant to Executive Order 19-11, ISBE is developing non-regulatory guidance and a model policy that are consistent with school district's obligations under state and federal laws.

ISBE encourages school districts to ensure that their policies, procedures, and practices are supportive of, and responsive to, the needs of transgender, nonbinary, and gender nonconforming students. ISBE expects that such policies, procedures, and practices are supportive of all students, regardless of their gender identity. Schools seeking assistance in addressing this issue in their schools and communities before the guidance documents are released are encouraged to consult with ISBE.
