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Dear Colleagues:

As we have settled into this novel new school year, we have all become more acutely aware of the areas where our communities need support. So today I want to focus on financial resources.

As you probably heard, we announced yesterday that we have awarded more than \$80 million in Digital Equity Formula Grants. This funding comes from the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, which directs federal funding to governors and State Education Agencies to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic. Closing the digital divide has been a priority for the agency since March, when the pandemic forced schools statewide to suddenly shift to remote learning. We saw in the spring that many schools did not have the technology or internet access necessary to connect students and teachers in real-time and to facilitate meaningful remote instruction. We have learned and prepared a lot since the spring, and we are excited to provide our highest-need schools the Digital Equity Formula Grant to strengthen their digital infrastructure this fall and for years to come.

LEAs eligible for the grant – those school districts, state-authorized charter schools, university lab schools, and alternative and SAFE school programs administered by Regional Offices of Education with an Evidence-Based Funding Final Percent of Adequacy of 70 percent or lower in fiscal year 2020 or FY 2021 – must complete and submit an application to ISBE for approval. LEAs that started or submitted an application for the previously competitive process will have their answers transfer into the updated application automatically.

Please note that LEAs may use the grant to purchase additional devices and connectivity or to cover purchases made since March 13, 2020. LEAs will receive reimbursement after submitting an approvable application and at least quarterly expenditure reports.

Even with the federal CARES Act funding, we know your schools and districts have additional needs. Illinois lawmakers will soon begin deciding how to allocate state funds in fiscal year 2022. ISBE advocates in the budget-making process for equitable funding for all Illinois students. We need your input to ensure our advocacy reflects your needs. Your requests will inform ISBE's budget recommendation to Governor Pritzker and the General Assembly in January 2021.

Testimony at past hearings has led to investments in innovative teacher preparation programs and continued funding for parent mentoring and after-school programs. Now more than ever, ISBE wants our school leaders, classroom teachers, parents, and community advocates to tell us what investments would make the biggest difference for their students, especially as the COVID-19 pandemic has widened equity gaps for many children. I also wanted to call your attention to a recent update from the U.S. Department of Education. The previous Interim Final Rule (IFR) regarding equitable services for nonpublic schools under the CARES Act is no longer in effect. On September 4, in NAACP v. DeVos, the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia issued an [opinion](https://oese.ed.gov/files/2020/09/NAACP-v-DeVos-DDC_Opinion-Granting-Partial-Summary-Judgment.pdf)  (https://oese.ed.gov/files/2020/09/NAACP-v-DeVos-DDC_Opinion-Granting-Partial-Summary-Judgment.pdf) and an [order](https://oese.ed.gov/files/2020/09/NAACP-v-DeVos-DDC_Order-granting-Partial-SJ-09-04-2020.pdf)  (https://oese.ed.gov/files/2020/09/NAACP-v-DeVos-DDC_Order-granting-Partial-SJ-09-04-2020.pdf) vacating the IFR, and although that September 4 order is appealable, the U.S. Department of Education withdrew the rule, saying it “is no longer in effect.”

LEAs should proceed with calculating nonpublic school proportionate share by the number of low-income students enrolled in a nonpublic school located in the LEA attendance area. Please find more information below.

I am profoundly aware that educators across the state are providing things money can't buy. You are sharing your time, your energy, and your boundless creativity in even greater measure than before. I'm proud and grateful to be working alongside you.

CARES ACT

EQUITABLE SHARE FOR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL PROPORTIONATE SHARE

The U.S. Department of Education (ED) published an [Interim Final Rule \(IFR\) regarding equitable services](#) (https://www.govinfo.gov/content/pkg/FR-2020-07-01/pdf/2020-14224.pdf) under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act on July 1, 2020. The U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia issued an [opinion](#) (https://oese.ed.gov/files/2020/09/NAACP-v-DeVos-DDC_Opinion-Granting-Partial-Summary-Judgment.pdf) and an [order](#) (https://oese.ed.gov/files/2020/09/NAACP-v-DeVos-DDC_Order-granting-Partial-SJ-09-04-2020.pdf) vacating the IFR in *NAACP v. DeVos* on Sept. 4, 2020 -- <https://oese.ed.gov/governors-emergency-education-relief-fund/> (https://oese.ed.gov/governors-emergency-education-relief-fund/).

ED withdrew the rule, saying it “is no longer in effect,” even the Sept. 4, 2020, NAACP v. DeVos order could be appealed. Thus, states and schools have clarity regarding equitable share. Local Education Agencies (LEAs) should calculate nonpublic school proportionate share by the number of low-income students enrolled in a nonpublic school located in the LEA attendance area. LEAs will engage in consultation and nonpublic schools will receive equitable services based upon the number of low-income children (ESEA Sec. 1117). LEAs may submit an amendment of the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) grant application to allow the public schools to utilize the reserve amount (the difference between the total ESSER LEA allocation and the amount calculated based upon total enrollment minus the low-income student proportionate share) to meet the intent of the grant.

2020-21 NONCERTIFIED STAFF AND TEACHER SALARY STUDY FORMS AVAILABLE – OCT. 1

ISBE's Data Strategies and Analytics team has announced both the 2020-21 Noncertified Staff Salary Study and Teacher Salary Study will be available in IWAS on **Oct. 1**. These forms must be completed and submitted by **Feb. 1, 2021**. It is the district administrator's responsibility to review the completed surveys for accuracy and submit it to ISBE.

Districts with **1,000** or more enrolled students as of the last school day in September 2020 must submit the Noncertified Staff Salary Study survey. The district administrator or a district document author may complete this survey.

Please email a copy of your salary schedule/policy and negotiated agreement to datahelp@isbe.net as part of completing the Teacher Salary Study. The subject line of the email should be "TSS Schedule and Labor Agreement SY20 [District Name and Number]." We will not accept mailed submissions. This is not necessary if you have previously provided copies of the schedule/policy and agreement and they are still in effect.

2021 DIGITAL EQUITY FORMULA GRANT APPLICATIONS NOW AVAILABLE

Applications for the Elementary and Secondary Relief – Digital Equity Formula grant awarded under the CARES Act are now available through IWAS for school year 2020-21 (fiscal year 2021). All eligible applicants must create and submit an application through the IWAS system. Once in the system, create the application by selecting the Yes box that appears. The fiscal year should display 2021, along with a Project Code and a Project Title. Choose "Create New Project" to create the application. **NOTE:** Entities that started or submitted a proposal for the competitive **Elementary and Secondary Relief – Digital Equity Request for Proposals (RFP)** will have previous answers to some narrative pages transferred into this formula grant application automatically.

Allocations: Illinois LEAs (including state-authorized charter schools, university lab schools, and Regional Offices of Education on behalf of qualifying safe schools and alternative programs) with an FY 2020 or FY 2021 Evidence-Based Funding (EBF) Final Percent of Adequacy level of 70 percent or lower are eligible to apply. Allocations were computed at a base funding amount plus a per pupil allocation for both devices and connectivity. The formula uses the Average Student Enrollment from FY 2021 EBF calculations. The base grant amount is \$28,975 with a per pupil allocation of \$56.80 for devices, connectivity or both. Application Due Date, Start Date, and Pre-award Costs: Applications are due to ISBE on or before Nov. 1, 2020, to ensure a July 1 start date. The CARES Act funds for the Digital Equity program allow for eligible expenditures to be charged back to March 13, 2020. In the event your LEA has eligible expenditures for the Digital Equity grant prior to July 1, please notify Erich Grauke in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction at egrauke@isbe.net (mailto:egrauke@isbe.net). Formal documentation will be provided from ISBE staff documenting the pre-award costs for audit purposes.

Reimbursement: Once approval is received, LEAs may submit expenditure reports via the Electronic Expenditure Reporting System in IWAS for reimbursement. Expenditure reports must be submitted on a cumulative (i.e., year-to-date) basis from July 1, 2020, through the date of the period reported. At minimum, quarterly expenditure reports will be required beginning with expenditures through Sept. 30. Funding and Disbursements staff voucher each Wednesday, so all expenditure reports submitted by Tuesday evening will be paid. Revenue should be receipted under revenue code 4998 Other Restricted Grants Received from Federal Government through the State.

Grant Accountability and Transparency Act Requirements:

Applicants must ensure Grant Accountability and Transparency Act (GATA) requirements are met before the FY 2021 state or federal grant application is fully executed. Applicants must complete prequalification registration in the GATA portal and complete a Fiscal and Administrative Risk Assessment via an Internal Controls Questionnaire (ICQ). The GATA portal can be accessed at <https://grants.illinois.gov/portal/> (<https://grants.illinois.gov/portal/>).

The steps below are necessary to fully execute the FY 2021 grants.

1. Grantee must register <https://grants.illinois.gov/portal/> (<https://grants.illinois.gov/portal/>) and complete ICQ.
2. Complete and submit the Organizational Risk Assessment via IWAS. Results will apply to all FY 2021 grants.
 - a. ISBE Grant-Specific Assessments will be included in each FY 2021 grant.
 - b. A combination of the results of the two risk assessments will generate the Programmatic Risk Conditions in each grant.
3. Submit FY 2021 grant applications to ISBE.
4. The respective ISBE program area will review and approve the application.

FY 2021 EBF SPENDING PLAN DUE SEPT. 30 – NEW WEBINAR AVAILABLE

School districts, Regional Offices of Education/Intermediate Service Centers, and laboratory schools have two weeks remaining to submit their FY 2021 EBF Spending Plan in IWAS. The EBF Spending Plan is due on **Sept. 30** per state statute regardless of the amount of EBF dollars received. All users are encouraged to hit "save" frequently in the IWAS application to avoid the 20-minute IWAS timeout.

CAPITAL NEEDS ASSESSMENT SURVEY – DUE NOV. 18

Section 5-60 of the School Construction Law [105 ILCS 230/5-60] requires the State Board of Education and the Capital Development Board file a comprehensive assessment report of the capital needs of all school districts with the General Assembly before Jan. 1, 2021. We are requesting that all school districts complete and submit the *Capital Needs Assessment Survey* by **Nov. 18**. The ongoing discussions about the School Construction Law, the formation of the School Construction Law Task Force, and the appropriation ISBE has received to issue School Maintenance Grants make it imperative that each school district submit its survey. ISBE will use the survey results to convey to lawmakers the capital needs required in our schools.

We understand and appreciate the incredibly hard work of district administrators throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, so we hope that sending the survey out early will give you ample time to review and report your district's facility needs by Nov. 18, 2020. We are asking regional superintendents to assist districts, if necessary, in completing the form to ensure 100 percent participation throughout the state. Please share the survey with your business manager, facility manager, or other employee(s) who may be assisting in the completion of the survey.
