Dear Colleagues:

One of the annual traditions we missed most last year was the Illinois State Fair. This year, it's back – with some COVID-19 precautions – and I hope many of you will come visit ISBE booth inside the Governor's Tent! We invite students, families, and educators to stop by our booth to learn about three important programs: Illinois High School 2 Career, Educators Rising, and the Virtual Learning Community that is part of our Resilience Education to Advance Community Healing (REACH) partnership with Lurie Children's.

I introduced Illinois High School 2 Career in last week's message. It's a cool new tool designed to help high school students learn how to achieve the future they envision by letting them input different variables and see results. The entire database was built using eight years of data from actual Illinois students. Students can use it to guide their high school course choices, as well as plans past graduation.

Educators Rising is a new Career and Technical Student Organization (CTSO) that all school districts can now sponsor using state and federal CTE funding. Educators Rising has our best teachers' seal of approval as a phenomenal leadership opportunity for those interested in exploring a career in education. In fact, the Illinois coordinator for the program is 2018 Illinois Teacher of the Year Lindsey Jensen.

The REACH Virtual Learning Community provides free, virtual, on-demand training and resources to help educators and families support the resilience of the children and youth. The trainings focus on trauma-responsive practices while fostering social-emotional awareness and self-care. Educators can use VLC to earn professional development credit or license clock hours while learning about trauma, race and equity, psychological first aid, and adult SEL.

Of course, there's more to the State Fair than just our booth. Families can visit the Illinois Department of Public Health tent to get a free dental screening for children Aug. 17-19, from 11 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. While you're there, you can also challenge your handwashing skills with Glo Germ – a lotion that reveals the spots you missed when you hold your "clean" hands under a UV light. Families can also find free school health screenings for children Aug. 20-21 from 10 a.m. – 5 p.m. Just look for the Mobile Care Chicago RV parked outside the Illinois Building, near the State Fair's main gate.

Throughout the fairgrounds, COVID-19 testing will be available. And fairgoers age 18 and up can get the one-dose Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine for free. All you'll need is a photo ID and your insurance card if you have one. There are six locations at the Fair where you can get the shot:

- Illinois Building - Just inside the Main Gate on Main Street
- North Side of Happy Hollow Entrance - On Main Street directly north of the Illinois Building
- Brian Raney Avenue - Directly north of the Village of Cultures, across the street from the Illinois Treasurer and Secretary of State Tents

- Avenue of Flags - Across the street from Gate 2 of the Grandstand
- 4H Lane - Near the Orion Samuelson Building north of the Multi-Purpose Arena on the west side of the fairgrounds (August 12-17)
- Livestock Center on 8th Street (August 18-22)

BULLYING PREVENTION POLICY DUE TO ISBE BY SEPT. 30

All public school districts, nonsectarian nonpublic schools, and charter schools in Illinois are required to develop and implement policies concerning bullying prevention, which must be filed with ISBE. **Districts/schools/facilities** will be able to submit their bullying policies via the [IWAS](https://sec.isbe.net/iwas/asp/login.asp?js=true) (https://sec.isbe.net/iwas/asp/login.asp?js=true) system, effective immediately.

Nonpublic special education facilities can continue to submit their policies via bullying@isbe.net (mailto:bullying@isbe.net) at this time.

ISBE's Student Care Department has announced a deadline of **Sept. 30** for entities to submit a bullying prevention policy for the 2021-22 school year that complies with [current requirements](https://www.ilga.gov/legislation/ilcs/fulltext.asp?DocName=010500050K27-23.7) (https://www.ilga.gov/legislation/ilcs/fulltext.asp?DocName=010500050K27-23.7).

FY 2022 ROUND 1 SCHOOL MAINTENANCE PROJECT GRANT NOW OPEN FOR APPLICATIONS

There is approximately \$47 million available for the FY 2022 Round 1 School Maintenance Project Grant. The application period is open in [IWAS](https://sec1.isbe.net/iwas/asp/login.asp?js=true) (https://sec1.isbe.net/iwas/asp/login.asp?js=true) from **8 a.m. Aug. 10 to 4 p.m. Oct. 8**. All applications must be submitted in IWAS to the Regional Office of Education by 4 p.m. Oct. 8; there will be no exceptions.

Grants will be approved up to the amount released by the Governor's Office of Management and Budget. Future application cycles will be open when funds are released.

The School Maintenance Project Grant is a dollar-for-dollar state matching grant program that provides awards of up to \$50,000 to grantees exclusively for the maintenance or upkeep of buildings or structures for educational purposes. Ongoing operational costs, including in-house labor for grant projects not contracted out, cannot be included for any School Maintenance Project Grant. A project may involve different types of work on a single building or structure or may involve a single type of work (e.g., new roofing or windows) on several buildings or structures. There is no limit to the cost of a project; however, grant awards shall not exceed \$50,000 per grant award, and applicants shall provide a match from local funds equal to the grant amount requested. An applicant must not obligate funds or begin work on any of the projects listed on the

application prior to submission of the application in IWAS. However, submission of the application does not guarantee a grant will be approved or awarded. All project activities must be expended or legally obligated within two years of disbursement by the state. If funds have been obligated by the grantee but not fully expended two years after disbursement, all obligations must be liquidated within 90 calendar days.

As per statute 30 ILCS 708/15, the costs of one state or federal grant cannot be used to meet the matching requirements of another state or federal grant. Therefore, dollars received through Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief fund cannot be utilized to meet the local match requirement for School Maintenance Project Grants.

Eligible Applicants: Any school district, cooperative high school, Type 40 area vocational center, or special education cooperative may apply for the grant.

All applicants must submit a Grant Accountability and Transparency Act Risk Assessment (found under Grants) and application (found under Surveys) for the School Maintenance Project Grant via the **IWAS** (<https://sec1.isbe.net/iwas/asp/login.asp?js=true>) System. Access to these systems is granted to district administrators. If another staff member will be completing the application, the district administrator will have to give authorization through IWAS.

UNLIMITED INTERNET AND SECURITY SERVICES AT NO CHARGE FOR ALL PUBLIC K-12

The Illinois Department of Innovation and Technology (DoIT), a state agency, and Illinois Century Network, the state managed fiber network, are providing all public K-12 districts with unlimited internet bandwidth and security services at no charge. Unlimited internet bandwidth means a school will have as much internet access as it requires. Security services include cyberattack mitigation and content filtering. Content filtering protects against malicious websites and harmful content.

ACCESS TESTING RESULTS UPDATE

A previous message indicated that early ACCESS and alternate ACCESS test results would be posted on Aug. 2. However, posting of the scores was delayed because the Student Information System (SIS) was undergoing maintenance during the early part of last week. Provisional ACCESS scores will be released shortly. ILLINOIS ASSESSMENT OF READINESS CORRECTIONS WINDOW EXTENDED

The Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR) corrections window has been extended until **11:59 p.m. Aug. 15**. Scores are now available in the Student Information System. District staff have until **11:59 p.m. Aug. 15** to make corrections for the purposes of the Individual Student Reports for all scores that are “unassigned” or not matched.

In addition, **Sept. 3** is the last day for corrections for the purposes of accountability and the Illinois Report Card for the 2020-21 school year. You may continue adding your RNVTA codes up until this date.

FY 2021 Site-Based Expenditure Reporting is due in IWAS by **Aug. 16**. Submissions may be edited until Aug. 31. ISBE strongly recommends that district leaders begin the reporting process at least a week before the deadline.
