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## Dear Colleagues:

Today, the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) and ISBE released updates to the public health guidance for schools, effective immediately. I want to highlight **two** changes: 1) times for isolation and quarantine and 2) Test to Stay protocol. Please find the revised guidance at:

First, IDPH and ISBE have adopted the new recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)

(https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/schools-childcare/k-12-guidance.html) for shorter quarantine and isolation periods of five days to focus on the period when a person is most infectious, followed by continued masking for an additional five days. Please review page X of the guidance and the Exclusion Protocols for full details on handling confirmed or probable cases, symptomatic individuals, and close contacts.

Keep in mind that students ages 5-17 who have received their primary vaccination doses and individuals age 18 and older who have received their booster doses are exempted from the definition of close contact. Students exposed in the classroom to another student, if both students were within 3-6 feet of each other and both were correctly and consistently masked, are also exempted from the definition of close contact. Consistent and correct masking indoors continues to be required (https://coronavirus.illinois.gov/resources/executive-orders/display.executive-order-number-18.2021.html) for all individuals in all public and nonpublic P-12 schools statewide.

Second, to align with the shortened quarantine and isolation periods, IDPH and ISBE have modified the Test to Stay protocol to require at least two tests within seven days after the close contact notification/Test To Stay enrollment, with the last test occurring 5-7 days after last close contact. We encourage all schools to participate in Test to Stay, which allows asymptomatic close contacts exposed during the school day (not during extracurricular activities) to remain in school, as long as they test negative.

I want to thank the Lake County schools that implemented Test to Stay this fall and served as the basis for this CDC article (https://www.cdc.gov/mmwr/volumes/70/wr/mm705152e2.htm?s\_cid=mm705152e2\_w). Illinois has led the nation in piloting (https://news.uillinois.edu/view/7815/300378312) the Test to Stay strategy and provides a state-funded option through a partnership between IDPH and SHIELD Illinois, which you can sign up for by completing this interest form. These schools' efforts have made a significant contribution to the global fight against the pandemic.

These updates will allow even more students to remain fully in-person at school – or provide a safe return more quickly – and will ease the burden on school testing programs.

Thank you for everything you're doing to protect and care for Illinois students and educators.

## PARENTING EDUCATION PILOT APPLICATION NOW AVAILABLE FOR ILLINOIS HIGH SCHOOLS

ParentAble teaches high school educators how to deliver parenting fundamentals to their students, helping them develop a foundational understanding of positive parenting practices. The ParentAble curriculum includes information about the effects of harmful parenting, the consequences of adverse childhood experiences, along with the power of resilience and positive parenting. The 5-10-unit course aims to reduce child abuse and neglect rates, break the cycle of harmful parenting, create a level of comfort in seeking future parenting resources and support, and increase students' social-emotional learning competencies.

This 10-day (35-minute unit per day) course can support the following high school areas: health and wellness coursework, career and technical education (CTE), child development, small group counseling interventions, credit recovery, and alternative placement schooling supports.

# **FUNDING AND DISBURSEMENTS**

## CENSUS ESTIMATES AFFECTING FY 2023 TITLE I FOR 2020 INCOME YEAR

The U.S. Department of Education has released the Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates (SAIPE) for income year 2020. These estimates will be used to calculate fiscal year 2023 Title I allocations. A file of 2020 Poverty Data by Local Education Agency (LEA) (/Pages/Census-Est-Affect-FY2023-Title-I-2020-Income-Year.aspx)is provided, including Poverty Count, 5-17 Population, and Poverty Percentage in the FY 2023 Preliminary Eligibility. Note that this preliminary data does not include other non-census information, such as foster, neglected, or delinquent counts, that will be included to calculate actual Title I allocations. This data allows LEAs to determine their potential eligibility for the various funding streams of Title I — Basic, Concentration, Targeted, and Education Finance Incentive Grants (EFIG).

- Basic Grant eligibility: An LEA must have at least 10 poverty children, and the number of poverty children must be greater than 2 percent of the LEA population of children ages 5-17.
- Concentration Grant eligibility: An LEA must have at least 6,500 poverty children, or the number of those children exceeds 15 percent of the total 5-17 population.
- Targeted Grant and EFIG eligibility: An LEA must have at least 10 poverty children, and that number must be at least 5 percent of the 5-17 population.

Superintendents, business managers, and Title I directors should carefully examine the data for their LEA, as this will be the first indication as to whether your LEA may be gaining or losing in eligibility for Title I funds in FY 2023. ISBE neither controls nor generates the data. There is a challenge period for LEAs to review the 2020 poverty and population data for certain non-statistical errors, which include errors the U.S. Census Bureau may have made in 1) processing input data or in running the estimation models/programs, or 2) preparing or processing information to define geographic boundaries (i.e., school district boundaries). This challenge period ends on **March 16**. Please contact the SAIPE program at (301) 763-3193 or sehsd.saipe@census.gov (mailto:sehsd.saipe@census.gov) to obtain information on the process to

challenge the data. #### INTERNET AND SECURITY SERVICES AT NO CHARGE THROUGH THE ILLINOIS CENTURY NETWORK

The Illinois Century Network (ICN) is the state network, owned and operated by the Illinois Department of Innovation and Technology, that serves public K-12 districts, higher education, libraries, municipalities, and state agencies.

The ICN provides internet access and security services at no charge to public K-12 districts. Adequate bandwidth for public K-12 districts is available. If you have filed E-rate paperwork or will be filing E-rate paperwork for service from **July 1**, we would highly recommend including an option to connect to the ICN.

Connecting to the ICN means you benefit from security services that include auto distributed denial of service mitigation, firewall, and Cisco Umbrella for security and content filtering, in addition to internet access at whatever speeds you require. More detail is provided in the Guidance for Public K-12 document (https://www2.illinois.gov/icn/projects/k12network/Documents/Welcome-ICN-Public-K-12.pdf). Section 3 gives a step-by-step guide to completing the E-rate paperwork. You can forward the document to an E-rate consultant to implement Section 3.

# STUDENT CARE

Public Act 102-0543 expands the demographic data collection and reporting requirements for the Illinois State Board of Education and 10 other state agencies to include age, sex, disability status, sexual orientation, gender identity, and primary or preferred language. The legislation will help researchers, lawmakers, and community stakeholders address education, health, and other social disparities facing people in Illinois, including the LGBTQ community.

LGBTQ youth are more likely (https://www.hrc.org/news/new-cdc-data-shows-lgbtq-youth-are-more-likely-to-be-bullied-than-straight-cisgender-youth) to experience bullying, violence, and victimization than straight, cisgender youth. For example, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's 2019 Youth Risk Behavior Survey shows that nationally 29 percent of transgender youth have been threatened or injured with a weapon on school property, compared to 7 percent of cisgender youth. Public Act 102- 0543

(https://www.ilga.gov/legislation/publicacts/fulltext.asp?Name=102-0543) will provide more complete demographic data collection for Illinois students, while first and foremost protecting student privacy, and will support schools' efforts to provide a safe and welcoming environment and equitable outcomes for all students.

The law was sponsored by Illinois House Majority Leader Greg Harris and State Senator Mike Simmons and was supported by the AIDS Foundation Chicago; Center on Halsted; Equality Illinois; Howard Brown Health; Pride Action Tank; SAGE; and Northwestern University's Evaluation, Data Integration, and Technical Assistance Program.

- The meningococcal publication should be provided to parents or guardians of age-appropriate students. The age-based recommendation for meningococcal vaccination is for children 11 years of age or older: English (/Documents/Meningococcal-Vaccines-English.pdf) and Spanish (/Documents/Meningococcal-Vaccines-Spanish.pdf).

IDHR ISSUES NON-REGULATORY GUIDANCE RELATING TO PROTECTION OF TRANSGENDER, NONBINARY, AND GENDER NONCONFORMING STUDENTS
