Message From State Superintendent Tony Smith, Ph.D.

Hello,

I would like to share some outstanding news about a former Illinois Teacher of the Year whose exceptional instruction is earning him worldwide accolades. Last week, Joe Fatheree of Effingham High School was named a top 10 finalist for the 2016 Varkey Foundation Global Teacher Prize. Dubbed the "Nobel Prize" for teaching, the honor awards \$1 million to a remarkable educator who has made a significant contribution to teaching and also illustrates teachers' crucial role in society.

Joe started teaching more than 25 years ago. Early of	on, he	ć
realized his students did not respond to the methods	s he	

learned while training to become a teacher. Joe worked with students to develop a series of lessons to meet his objectives and keep them engaged, including a project that used hip hop music to explore literature. His creativity paid off, and Joe saw an improvement in students' attendance, discipline, and overall

achievement.



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Joe currently teaches media production and innovation. He helps his students learn by producing music, books, and short films on topics including poverty, death, bullying, homelessness, and human rights. His students use 3D printing and drone technology in their projects, build educational games for young children using Minecraft, and engage in public speaking. Joe blends project-based learning with opportunities for students to work with industry leaders and local businesses.

Joe's passion, commitment, and effectiveness led to his selection as the 2007 Illinois Teacher of the Year. Two years later, he received the NEA Member Benefits Award for Teaching Excellence. Joe has developed a program that encourages graduates to return home to develop start-ups. This program now operates in more than 30 cities. He is also an advisor to the Independent Television Service and has helped develop learning materials for millions of students across the United States. In December, Joe and three other Illinois educators - Jacqueline Lopushonsky of Lincoln Elementary School (Wheaton), Paul Solarz of Westgate Elementary School (Arlington Heights), and Mark Vondracek of Evanston Township High School – were selected from 8,000 nominations and applications from 148 countries as top 50 finalists for the Global Teaching Prize. Stephen Hawking announced the top 10 finalists in a <u>video message</u> on Feb. 17. The winner will be named at the Global Education and Skills Forum in Dubai on March 13.

Nutrition and Wellness Programs

New Rules: PE Assessment and Data Collection and Reporting

<u>Public Act 98-0859</u> created the Stakeholder and Expert Task Force on Physical Education. The purpose of this task force was to submit recommendations for ISBE to consider for adopting rules for implementation of physical fitness assessments as well as the collection and reporting of aggregate fitness information.

The assessment to be used in schools would measure "aerobic capacity, body composition, muscular strength, muscular endurance and flexibility" of students in grades 3 and above in order to ascertain the effectiveness of Goal 20 of the Illinois Learning Standards for physical development and health, which is to achieve and maintain a health-enhancing level of physical fitness based upon continual self-assessment.

The task force submitted its recommendations to ISBE on April 1, 2015, and after seeking public comment,

ISBE adopted rules based on these recommendations. These rules went into effect Jan. 27 and were released on Feb. 16 in the Illinois Register (Part 1, Section 1.425, pages 2,991 and 3,013-3,016). The new Section 1.425(g) puts into rule the Task Force's recommendations regarding the use of the Fitnessgram or the Brockport Physical Fitness Testing for students with disabilities whose individualized education program identifies the Fitnessgram as not appropriate. Scores achieved on the testing may not be used as part of a student's grade or to evaluate a teacher.

Schools must begin using the Fitnessgram assessments in the 2016-17 school year and electronically report results from the fitness testing to the State Board (through IWAS) by May 1, 2017, and annually thereafter.

Register for Upcoming Employee Evaluations Webinar March 9

The Center for Performance and Data Analysis divisions will host a webinar on employee evaluations from 1 to 3 p.m. March 9. Further communication that specifies which districts are required to participate is forthcoming. While not all districts are required to participate in evaluations yearly, ISBE encourages all districts to attend the webinar.

The webinar will contain two sections: one for administrators that discusses evaluations from the statute perspective and one for data entry staff that outlines how to submit the evaluations through the Employment Information System (EIS). **ISBE** recommends that participating districts have both an administrator and a data entry staff person attend the webinar.

Employee evaluations were mandated in Senate Bill 315; Public Act 96-0861, which states in section 105 ILCS 5/24A-5 that:

"By no later than Sept. 1, 2012, each school district shall establish a teacher evaluation plan that ensures that:

- (1) each teacher not in contractual continued service is evaluated at least once every school year; and
- (2) each teacher in contractual continued service is evaluated at least once in the course of every 2 school years. However, any teacher in contractual continued service whose performance is rated as either "needs improvement" or "unsatisfactory" must be evaluated at least once in the school year following the receipt of such rating."

Funding and Disbursements

New Census Estimates Released for FY 2017 Title I Low Income

The U.S. Department of Education has released the Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates (SAIPE) for income year 2014. These estimates will be used to calculate fiscal year 2017 Title I allocations. A file of 2014 Poverty Data by Local Education Agency (LEA) is provided in an alphabetical listing of LEAs, Poverty Count, 5-17 Population, Poverty Percentage and Total Population at www.isbe.net/funding/excel/title1-census-fy17.xlsx.

With this data, LEAs can determine their potential eligibility for Basic, Concentration, Targeted and Education Finance Incentive grants.

Basic Grant eligibility: An LEA must have at least 10 poverty children and the number of poverty children must be greater than 2 percent of the LEA population of children ages 5-17.

Concentration Grant eligibility: An LEA must have at least 6,500 poverty children or the number of those children exceeds 15 percent of the total 5-17 population.

Targeted Grant and EFIG qualifications: An LEA must have at least 10 poverty children and that number must be at least 5 percent of the 5-17 population.

The following link to the Census Bureau, www.census.gov/did/www/saipe/index.html, provides various aspects of the SAIPE count, including the data sources and methodology used to prepare these data. We will be using the 2014 data to calculate school year 2016-17 Title I, Part A allocations because they are the most recent available data.

Superintendents, business managers, and Title I directors should carefully examine the data for their LEA as this will be the first indication as to whether your LEA may be gaining or losing in eligibility for Title I funds in FY 2017. ISBE neither controls nor

generates the data. The challenge period for the 2014 estimates ends March 8. Refer to the Census Bureau link at

www.census.gov/did/www/saipe/contact/challenges.ht ml, if interested.

Note that this preliminary data does not include other non-census information, such as foster, neglected, or delinquent counts that may be used to calculate Title I allocations.
