Message From State Superintendent Tony Smith, Ph.D.

Hello,

Safe school environments create the space for students to try new things, to question and challenge each other, and to learn to be their best selves. All of our students deserve to be and feel safe in school.

Last week I had the opportunity to visit Dewey Elementary School in Evanston/Skokie School District 65. I was excited to see the educators, administrators, and staff at Dewey focused on the education of the whole child. They place as much value on students' social emotional well-being and growth as they do on students' academic achievement.

Dewey is working to build a culture where all members of the community are safe to make and learn from their mistakes. The goal of Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) at Dewey is to “create a positive environment where children learn to own their behaviors, correct their mistakes, and develop empathy for others.” Dewey has implemented restorative practices hand in hand with the PBIS framework. Teachers, staff, students, and families are all working to use the system and make it productive for students. Circles are one restorative practice that can be used to build community, repair

harm, and resolve conflict. Circles foster self-reflection, empathy, leadership, equity, and inclusion. At Dewey, circles do not only happen in classrooms; there are circles in other spaces, such as in PE class, during lunch, in staff meetings, and in PTA meetings. When the system is truly functioning well, students are able to discern a place of emotional readiness within themselves and among their peers so they can work through issues. At Dewey, students are self-regulating and engaging in restorative practice themselves. If there is a conflict on the football field, they are leaving the field and calling circles.

The integration of restorative practice has been an organic process for the school and has been reinforced through professional learning and district-level support. The district is thinking about the big

questions of equity and inclusion, as evidenced by its [Racial and Educational Equity Statement](#). The district's commitment and support have allowed these courageous conversations to be held in a safe environment.

Schools are incredible places to build awareness and relationships, and to learn how to be good community members. I am in awe of the capacity of our young people to engage in courageous conversations as thoughtful and informed participants. Naperville North High School junior Samia Abdul-Qadir attended President Trump's address to the joint session of Congress yesterday in Washington, D.C., as the guest of U.S. Representative Bill Foster. Samia shared her personal experiences at Foster's recent community discussion at the Islamic Center of Naperville. Samia's story illustrates the power of youth leadership and the importance of diverse student populations speaking to the needs of our communities.

You may have already seen our [press release](#) last week about the Advanced Placement (AP) accomplishments of Illinois students and districts, but I would like to again recognize the students and educators for their hard work to close equity gaps. We have a record numbers of graduates both taking and excelling on AP exams. Illinois has made it a priority to continue to increase access to these courses. In December 2016, the Illinois State Board of Education approved an agreement with the College Board to maintain the cost of taking AP tests at \$15 per exam for low-income students for the May 2017 test administration.
