ISBE's Nutrition and Wellness Programs Division administers the U.S. Department of Agriculture's School Breakfast Program, which is part of the National School Lunch Program. Thank you to all of the schools that participate and a special thank you to the school nutrition professionals across the state who help make breakfast and other meals and snacks available to students. This year's theme, "Take the School Breakfast Challenge," encourages families, students, and school officials to start their morning with a healthy breakfast.

This Thursday marks <u>International School Meals Day</u>, which highlights the importance of school meal programs worldwide and aims to foster awareness around healthy eating. Food serves as a mechanism through which we can learn about and connect with each other – and this year's theme, "Food, Culture, and Heritage," promotes excitement around learning and connecting. National School Breakfast Week and International School Meals Day fall during <u>National Nutrition Month</u>, created by the <u>Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics</u>. Apply for the Fuel Up to Play 60 School Nutrition Equipment Grants

The Midwest Dairy Council will offer the Fuel Up to Play 60 School Nutrition Equipment Grants again this year. The grant application is available at FuelUpToPlay60.com.

The purpose of the grant is to provide funding to School Nutrition Departments to purchase equipment for up to three schools per district that will enhance the long-term implementation of their school meal programs with a preference to increasing school breakfast participation by offering it outside the cafeteria.

- Understand the importance of food safety and pesticide exposure in these pest vulnerable areas.
- Implement tactics to eliminate pests in these areas; as well as, address other facility maintenance issues, such as mold and moisture control.
