Illinois Community College Board

ICCB and College Board to Conduct SAT Benchmark Study

The Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) recently entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with the College Board to conduct a four-year study on SAT benchmarks specifically utilizing Illinois data, based upon Illinois student performance, and targeting English and math placement in the community college system. The overall goal of this research is to assist the

ICCB with the establishment of a common *voluntary* placement framework for students that increases equity, predictability, articulation, and portability across Illinois community colleges. To meet this goal, the ICCB is committed to engaging educators in a collaborative process focused on consensus building and the development of an agreed upon framework for adoption. In the meantime, the ICCB recommends that Illinois community colleges use current SAT benchmarks for placement decisions into credit-bearing courses. Illinois Report Card

Compare Schools Feature Now Enhanced on Illinois Report Card

The Illinois Report Card has launched a more robust Compare Schools feature. Users can now compare up to eight schools in three categories – Fast Facts, Academic Progress, and School Environment. The blue Compare button in the upper right corner of every page takes you to this function. New tools to help users find meaningful comparisons include a “shopping bag” of selected schools and simple methods for adding or removing schools. The information included in the comparisons goes beyond test scores to show school highlights submitted by principals, college readiness benchmarks, student characteristics, and district finances.

Work is continuing on more enhancements to the Report Card, including comprehensive data on students with IEPs and an Advanced Comparisons tool that will be available in October 2017.

Data Analysis

Employee Evaluations Due in EIS by Aug. 1

This is a reminder that employee evaluations are due on **Tuesday, August 1** in the Employment Information System (EIS). Evaluations were mandated in the Performance Evaluations Reform Act in Senate Bill 315; Public Act 96-0861.

What’s due by August 1, 2017:

- Teacher evaluation summative rating
- Principal and assistant principal summative rating

NOTE: If a teacher was not evaluated in SY 2017, you do not need to enter an evaluation. Teachers, principals, and assistant principals are the only positions requiring evaluations. No other EIS positions require an evaluation. No evaluations are required for district superintendents.

2016-17 Dental and Eye Examination Data Collection

Dental Examination Data

As mandated by Section 5/27-8.1 of the School Code, student dental data must be submitted on or before **June 30**. Please submit this data through IWAS. For assistance with your submission, please refer to the IWAS Dental User Guide at www.isbe.net/Documents/dental_user_guide.pdf.

- The **IDPH Dental Examination Waiver Form** is for students who are unable to obtain the required dental examination. The form is at www.idph.state.il.us/forms/ohpm/Dental%20Exam%20Waiver.pdf.
- The **Dental Information-Data Entry Worksheet** allows you to enter your data and double-check your aggregate numbers. Find it at www.isbe.net/documents/dental_worksheet.xls.

Public school districts may enter the data for each of their schools or approve school IWAS users to enter the data. Regardless of who enters data, it is the responsibility of the nonpublic school administrator/public school district administrator to

review the accuracy of entered data and assure submission of the finished data to ISBE by the deadline. Again, note that all dental data must be submitted for all schools serving any combination of kindergarten, grade 2, and/or grade 6 students (enrolled as of May 15) **by June 30**.

Eye Examination Data

The Student Health Vision System is open for data entry through **June 30**. The data must be submitted online in this timeframe using IWAS. Once logged into IWAS, the “Student Health Data – Vision” link will appear on the System Listing page under “Annual.”

As mandated by Section 5/27-8.1 of the School Code, vision data must be submitted for all eligible schools serving kindergarten and any students enrolled for the first time in an Illinois school as of Oct. 17, 2016, by **11:59 p.m. June 30**.

A report must be submitted for every eligible school, without exception. Schools that are not the home school for any student should submit the report by selecting the option that declares they have no data to report. This option may also be selected by home schools that do not serve kindergarten students and had no students in grades 1-12 enrolling for the first time in an Illinois school. All eligible schools should receive IWAS inbox messages regarding Student Health Data -Vision Data Collection. Please check your IWAS inbox for reminders and updates.

Grant Accountability Transparency Act

Required FY 2018 GATA Grantee Pre-Qualification Process

All grantees must complete the registration process and be qualified to do business with the State of Illinois.

The grantee pre-qualification registration portal may be accessed directly on the GATA website at www.illinois.gov/sites/GATA/Grantee/Pages/default.aspx.

To be qualified to **apply** for an FY 2018 grant award, an entity must complete the following four steps:

1. Authentication (New for FY 2018)

The Grantee Portal can be accessed through the Grantee Links heading on the GATA website. A personal or business email address is required to establish an account. Authentication is required through the Illinois.gov authentication portal. It establishes or verifies the relationship between an individual and the organization they represent. Authentication is performed once for each individual associated with a registration. If your email was not previously associated with the organization that you represent, click the “Create a new account” link below the “Sign in” button. After you have entered the required information, you will receive a confirmation email that will instruct you to click a link to complete the account creation process. 2. Registration

Once your Illinois.gov account is created, you must return to the Grantee Portal log-in screen and enter your user name and password to continue. The system will then ask for your organization’s DUNS number. If the DUNS

number for your organization is on record with GATA from the previous year, the system will associate you with your organization. The process may require the approval of the primary GATA system registrant for your organization. After accessing your entity’s registration information, you must click the “Edit” button found near the top of the screen. This will allow you to correct/confirm the listed information and select the appropriate organization type for your entity.

If the DUNS number that you enter is not found in the GATA system, the system will invite you to create a new grantee account for the entity related to that DUNS number. Please confirm that you entered the correct DUNS number before creating a new account. Creation of a new grantee account is accomplished by providing your organization’s:

- DUNS number (click [HERE](#) to view instructions on obtaining a DUNS number);
- FEIN;
- Organization type (NOTE: school districts, special education joint agreements, and education for employment consortiums should select “School District”);
- Secretary of State ID (NOTE: the following types of organizations have been deemed EXEMPT from this requirement: school districts, colleges, universities, Regional Offices of Education, special education joint agreements, and education for employment consortiums);
- Organization name; and
- Address.

3. Grantee Pre-qualification

All entities must be qualified to do business with the State of Illinois. To be qualified for a grant award, an entity must:

- Be registered in the GATA Grantee Portal system as described above;

- Have a valid DUNS number (click [HERE](#) to view instructions on obtaining a DUNS number);
- Have a current SAM.gov account (click [HERE](#) to view instructions on obtaining a SAM Cage Code);
- Not be on the Federal Excluded Parties List (click [HERE](#) to verify utilizing the Quick Search);
- Be in Good Standing with the Illinois Secretary of State, as applicable (click [HERE](#) to verify). (NOTE: The following types of organizations have been deemed EXEMPT from this requirement: school districts, colleges, universities, Regional Offices of Education, special education joint agreements, and education for employment consortiums.);
- Not be on the Illinois Stop Payment list; and
- Not be on the Department of Healthcare and Family Services Provider Sanctions list.

Pre-qualification status will be verified after Grantee Registration is submitted and nightly thereafter. If an entity has a pre-qualification issue, the specific issue and remediation support is provided through the Grantee Portal. Entities on the Federal Excluded Parties List are not eligible to do business with the State of Illinois.

4. Fiscal and Administrative Risk Assessment (ICQ)

Entities must complete an FY 2018 Internal Controls Questionnaire (ICQ) as the Fiscal and Administrative Risk Assessment. The ICQ is completed annually for each fiscal year. All state agencies will utilize the results of the ICQ. The entity can access the ICQ from the Grantee Portal. The portal provides access to prior year ICQ responses for those entities that received grants in FY 2017. The FY 2018 ICQ template must be completed prior to making application for an FY 2018 grant. The ICQ should be completed by someone with financial or accounting experience.

The status of compliance with each of the requirements described above is displayed in the Grantee Portal for each registered entity. Again, **completion of these four steps is required prior to making application for funding for FY 2018.**

Entities must also complete a programmatic risk assessment for each grant award in FY 2018. **The programmatic risk assessment will be included in each electronic grant application through ISBE. Paper grant applicants will be directed to the IWAS system once applications have been received.**

The SAM.gov registration expires annually and must be renewed to maintain your eligibility for funding. Renewal of your cage code at the SAM.gov web site **does not** require a fee.
