

The <u>list of School Food Authorities Tentatively Selected for School Year 2023-24 Administrative Reviews</u> is now available on the ISBE <u>Monitoring and Review Information webpage</u>.

The Administrative Review is an assessment conducted by the Illinois States Board of Education (ISBE) of the School Food Authority's (SFA) administration of the NSLP and SBP, and other School Nutrition Programs. The objectives of the Administrative Review are to determine whether the SFA meets program requirements, provide technical assistance, secure any needed corrective action, and assess fiscal action, if applicable.

Buy American Provision

Exceptions to Buy American

There are two limited exceptions when non-domestic foods may be purchased. These exceptions are determined by the SFA:

- The food or food product is not produced or manufactured in the United States in sufficient and reasonably available quantities of a satisfactory quality; or
- Competitive bids reveal the cost of a United States food or food product is significantly higher than the nondomestic product.

School Breakfast Program Mandate

Per <u>105 ILC126/15</u> every public school in which at least 40 percent of students were eligible for free or reduced-price lunches in **October of school year 2022-23** must plan to operate a <u>School Breakfast Program</u> for school year 2024-25.

Opt-Out Provision - School Breakfast Program:

- District must submit cost analysis to their regional superintendent of education no later than **February 15, 2024.**
- By March 15, 2024, Regional Superintendent holds public hearing.
- If the Regional Superintendent does not grant an exemption, school district must operate a breakfast program in school year 2024-25 in the school(s) noted OR the district (or a resident of the district) may appeal the decision to the State Superintendent of Education by April 15, 2024. If appealed, State Superintendent must hold hearing and state conclusion by May 15, 2024.



Summer Food Service Mandate

Per 105 ILCS 126/20,

- every public school building in which at least 50 percent of the students were eligible for free and reduced-price lunches in October 2023
- AND has a summer program operating during the 2024 summer months must provide a <u>summer breakfast and/or lunch program</u> for the children in that community.
- The plan must be implemented each year so long as the above criteria are met and must operate for the duration of the school's summer school program.
- A school wishing to utilize the opt-out provision [105 ILCS 126/20 (d)] of the program for the upcoming summer must petition their regional superintendent by Jan. 15, 2024.



Summer Food Service Mandate

Who must operate a summer feeding program?

School Food Authority: Please complete the brief checklist below to determine if the buildings in your district are required to operate a summer feeding program:

- 1. Is the school building part of a public or private district?
- Public, proceed to the next question
- Private, you are not required to operate any summer feeding program
- 2. Will your district be conducting summer school or enrichment programs?
- ☐ Yes, proceed to the next question
- No, you are **not** required to operate any summer feeding program
- If yes, what is the most recent October free and reduced eligibility rate for the building where you will be conducting the summer school program?

Check eligibility rate:

- 0.49%-Most recent October free and reduced eligibility rate, not required to operate any summer feeding program. (You may choose to feed children enrolled in the summer school program and continue to claim as categorically eligible in the School Breakfast Program, National School Lunch Program and Afterschool Snack Program.)
- 50-100% Most recent October free and reduced eligibility rate, must offer breakfast and/or lunch to students enrolled in the summer school program and open the meal program to the community* for the duration of the scheduled summer program.
- *School buildings with 50% or greater in the most recent October free and reduced eligibility rate must operate a summer feeding program in buildings where summer school is being conducted. To operate a site open to the community the School Food Authority must apply for one of the following programs:

Seamless Summer Option (SSO): Available to schools which operate NSLP during the regular school year. SSO application is added to the existing site application in WINS system. Summer Food Service Program (SFSP): Sponsors may opt to participate in the SFSP to meet the meal service requirements for summer meals. For additional information on how to apply and requirements visit the SFSP webpage: www.isbe.net/SFSP

Local foods have been made available to approximately 317,273 students in Illinois.



Foods have been purchased direct from farmers, processors, food co-ops and distributors.




150 School Food Authorities have signed up.

Important Note on Allowable Purchases:

Milk is not an allowable use of LFS funds. One of the requirements of LFS is that the funds are be used for new local foods or an expansion of current local foods products and cannot be duplicative.





FY 25 School Breakfast Program Expansion Grant

RFP to be released January 2024

Must be at 40% or higher free and reduced eligibility percentage

Priority given to LEAs at 75% or higher

Up to \$10,000 per school (site) to be used to purchase equipment, marketing materials, staffing, etc.

1 required in person training and multiple virtual meetings Recipients required to provide data on the impact purchases made on their SBP
