AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN (ARP) IDEA USE OF FUNDS

The <u>OSEP FACT SHEET: ARP of July of 2021</u> indicated that all IDEA Part B ARP funds must be used consistently with the current IDEA Part B statutory and regulatory requirements. This means they would be subject to all of the same requirements and provisions under IDEA, EDGAR, and the Uniform Grant Guidance.
