

VI. Performance of RSSP Students on State Achievement Tests

There were 1,427 RSSP students in grades 6, 7, 8, and 11 (**71 percent** of total grades 6-8 and 11 students enrolled in RSSP) who took the Illinois Standards Achievement Test (ISAT) or Prairie State Achievement Examination (PSAE) in 2011. The following charts show their performance levels on the 2011 ISAT or PSAE. Chart 6 compares the performance of RSSP versus non-RSSP students on the ISAT or PSAE.

Chart 2. Percentage of RSSP Students Who Met or Exceeded State Standards in Reading and/or Mathematics, by Grade Level: 2011




Chart 3. Percentage of RSSP Students Who Met or Exceeded State Standards in Reading and/or Mathematics, by Student Eligibility Status: 2011




Chart 4. Percentage of RSSP Students Who Met or Exceeded State Standards in Reading and/or Mathematics, by Primary Referral: 2011






APPENDIX B

Description of Offenses

Alcohol (liquor law violations, possession, use, sale)

Disorderly conduct (disruptive behavior)

Drugs, excluding alcohol and tobacco (illegal drug possession, sale, use/under the influence)

Fighting (mutual altercation, battery, and/or physical altercation)

Harassment, nonsexual (physical, verbal, or psychological)

Insubordination (disobedience to school staff or school personnel)

Robbery (taking of things by force) or theft

Threats (including school threats)

Vandalism (damage to school or personal property)

Violation of school rules (disobeying school policy)

Weapons possession (firearms and other weapons)
